Father-Daughter Event

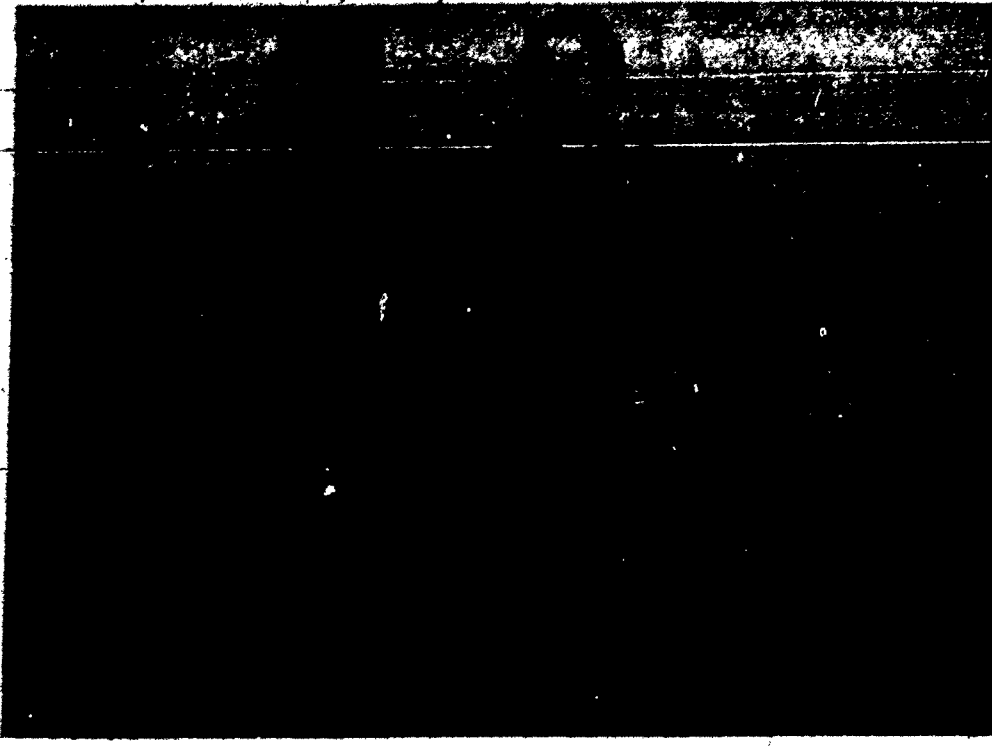
