A refugee child in Hong Kong in flight from Mao as the Christ child was from Herod . . . a leper with white scars on lips closing on a white Host in Communion . . . an African mother with a child strapped on her back walking twenty miles to see a statue of a Mother with a Child clasped to her breast . . . a priest whose rectory is a Volkswagon and who is 750 miles away from the nearest priest . . . a nun who is the only Medical Doctor for four million Moslems . . . a priest carrying coal two miles in a basket in China and secretly giving absolution to the faithful on the roadway . . . a Communist officer going back to the house of a Bishop he arrested and killed, then throwing a rope over a ditch in the Bishop's chapel and dragging him out (one who had been quickened by the hand of God) . . . a nun shaming a Communist guard who spat in her face and saying: "Now I know how Our Lord felt" . . . a little girl of four concealing the Blessed Sacrament in trans to bring Holy Communions to the Faithful in a China prison . . . a missioner too exhausted from Communism cruelty to even count the rosary on his fingers, doing so with ten little bamboo splinters in the dust of his prison cell . . .

On Mission Sunday give yourself a "break." Do not just give off the top of the barrel; rather do something to prove you love Christ in the poor. Act as you would act if you saw Christ in the nuns and priests in Shanghai prisons or Mongolian prison camps. Can you believe too much in God? Can you sacrifice too much for Christ? If you choose to be prudent on Mission Sunday ask with Zahnias, "What wounds be these in Thy clasped hands? God answers: "Thus wounded was I, wounded in the house of My friends."

Open your eyes! See the members of the Mystical Body, hungry, leprosy, stumbling to the light! Go not on weeping daily chains them into the pit of darkness! Oh, we are so vainly busy that we neglect little candles with tiny little offerings, devotions and kindnesses when we should be alight with love. Did not Our Lord say that He came to cast fire upon the earth, and "what will I but that it be kindled"? And what happened on the eve of Good Friday? Jesus came with fire; the only fire there were the fires of the enemy.

Sleep not on Mission Sunday, for the Communist sleeps not! There may not even be a collection in your Church for the Holy Father's Society for the Propagation of the Faith on Mission Sunday. FLEEING THEIR CLOISTER

during the Muslim invasion in the seventh century, the monks of the monastery of Beiteddine near Beirut in Syria, established a new monastery and began the formation of a new country which is Lebanon as we know it today. Followers of Saint Maron, these monks established not only their own government but also their own Republic, the Maronite Republic of the Castles Church. About 200,000 Maronites constitute the largest Catholic group presently in Lebanon; they are concentrated mainly in the north of the country and, for the most part, are very poor.

Maronite Catholics in the village of Marouna have started building a small church in honor of Saint Elias. Since they are erecting it themselves, the laborers are involved in the construction but \$1,000 is needed to buy the necessary materials. The Maronites, who have lived a life of heroic sacrifice for their faith, are themselves referred to as "The Irish of the East." Could you help the people of this village build their Church?
