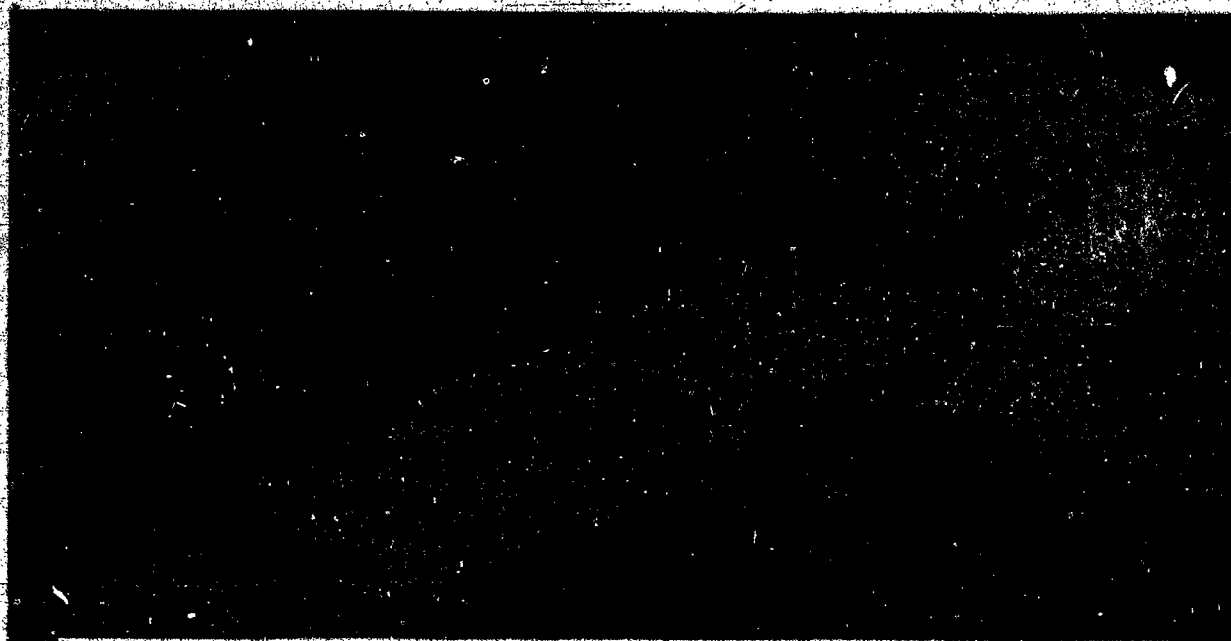

Five Parishes Launch Fund Drives, New Churches, Schools To Be Built

Five suburban Rochester parishes launched fund drives this week with a combined goal of \$550,000.

Two of the parishes were just established this year. One recently marked its first birthday; another is less than ten years old and the fifth is over a century old.

The two new parishes are Our Lady Queen of Peace and Guardian Angels.

Father James Slattery, Queen of Peace pastor, announced a "minimum goal" of \$100,000. He said a parish campaign will be headed by Martin Q. Moll. The campaign goal includes the parish quota for the two new high schools.

Edward Ribson is drawing plans for the proposed Queen of Peace church and school to be built on Edgewood Ave., Brighton.

Guardian Angels pastor, Father John Kleinfeltz, currently using the Genesee Regional Market for Sunday Masses, headed a goal of \$75,000 for a fund drive in that parish.

Robert Hall has drawn the plans for the new Guardian Angels church and school to be built on Castle Rd., Henrietta.

Donald VanDoren and David Quigley are chairman of the drive.

Year old St. Lawrence parish in Greece, scheduled to begin use of its new church Sunday, Oct. 30, feast of Christ the

King, will conduct a "full force" campaign to meet \$200,000 costs of the church, rectory and high school's quota.

The new church on North Greece Road was built with extensive help of men of the parish.

It was designed by the late Walter Nugent and his successor, Phillip Winkler. Contractor was Lawrence Bufano.

Father Edward Shannon, pastor, said fund drive officers are Donald Kridel and Sarto Stallknecht, chairman; John Sillik and Edwin Wegman, members and Edwin Wegman, member gifts chairman.

Our Lady of Mercy parish, Denio Road, also in Greece, seeks \$150,000 to build a new church and to convert existing chapel facilities into classrooms.

Father John Whalen, pastor, said this goal includes a \$37,000 quota for the new high school's campaign.

The proposed new church will be designed to serve as a hall. Folding partitions will screen off the altar when not in use for Mass or other religious rites.

Campaign officers have not as yet been named.

Mother of Sorrows parish, its church a century-long landmark in Greece, engaged with extensive tracts of new homes development drive. The goal also includes the parish quota for the high schools. Father Daniel O'Rourke, pastor, said the campaign committee is being organized this week.

Nazareth Nurse Voted 'Ideal'
