egime of Cuban Premier Fidel Castro are being denied the last sacraments, a newspaper here has stated.

Meanwhile, two former oficals of the Castro regime who proke with it when it drifted toward communism have arrived here seeking asylum.

The Disrie de la Marina, Havana daily-in-exile published here, said: "We have learned that these sentenced to die (by the Castro-regime) were taken to the execution wall without being allowed to receive religious aid."


Another Cuban newspaper in exile, Diarlo El Avance Criollo, declared that since taking over he government in January, 1959, the Castro regime has laimed 12,238 victims - dead. wounded and prisoners. Its re-port included the following statistics:

-Officially executed, 608. -Executed without trial, 241. -Political assassinations, 152. Died while in prison or under detention, 99. Other deaths, 333.

Wounded in political prisons, 142. Other wounded, 509. -Missing opponents of Cas-

tro government, 23.
