Jesuits Chart Space Trips

Castelgandolfo — (RNS) — Remained somewhat from the clamor of the cold war missile race, a team of Jesuit scientists is quietly preparing the way for man's first venture into space.

They are the astronomers and astrophysicists who staff the Vatican Observatory near the Pope's summer residence here.

THEIR JOB of charting the published a ten-volume catalog from the annual observatory, existing account of more than 100,000 known stars.

But the missile experts emerged a million known stars.

The observatory's primary work is improving and adding to the maps and catalogues of the most distant stars.

Established in 1582 by Pope Gregory XIII, the Vatican Observatory has grown steadily.

Aiding the Jesuit scientists in their work is an impressive array of some of the most advanced optical research centers.

It is used by the Jesuit astronomers who visited the observatory in 1956 were particularly struck by a device that

photographs the heliosphere.

The observatory's most outstanding achievement is the which it added highly important information to the knowledge of the solar spectrum.

Specialized photographs of the visible night sky, representing 75 years of tireless research, have been supplied to observatories around the world ever and to plot long-distance routes.

Headed by Father Daniel O'Connell, S.J., the six Jesuit scientists today are bringing the fruits of more than three centuries of research over the threshold of the space age.

Reds Close Church Built By Volunteers

Berlin — (NC) — An old barn which was converted into a Catholic church by the volunteer labor of Catholic and Protestant workers has been closed by the communist regime in East Germany, it was learned here.

The new church, which was to have been blessed this September, is located in Kollwitz, near Magdeburg.

It was sealed shut by the Communist regime on grounds that a Catholic church is not necessary there. The parish consists of 300 Catholics coming from 10 nearby villages.

Prior to the renovation of the barn, Sunday Mass was offered in the local Protestant church, while weekday Masses were said in an attic room.

Catholic and Protestant workers donated 4,500 hours of their spare time toward converting the old barn into a church.

JUDGE ROGERS was born in Caledonia and attended school there, graduating from high school. In three years, at the age of 16, with a high school record.

Married, he resides of 165 Saratoga Ave. in the Ninth Ward, is a member of St. Anthony of Padua Church, Rochester Bar Association, Rochester Ad Club, Elks and Knights of Columbus, Fourth Degree.
