Mr. Somerville, born in New York City, retired in 1958 after seven years as vice president of Broadcast Music, Inc.

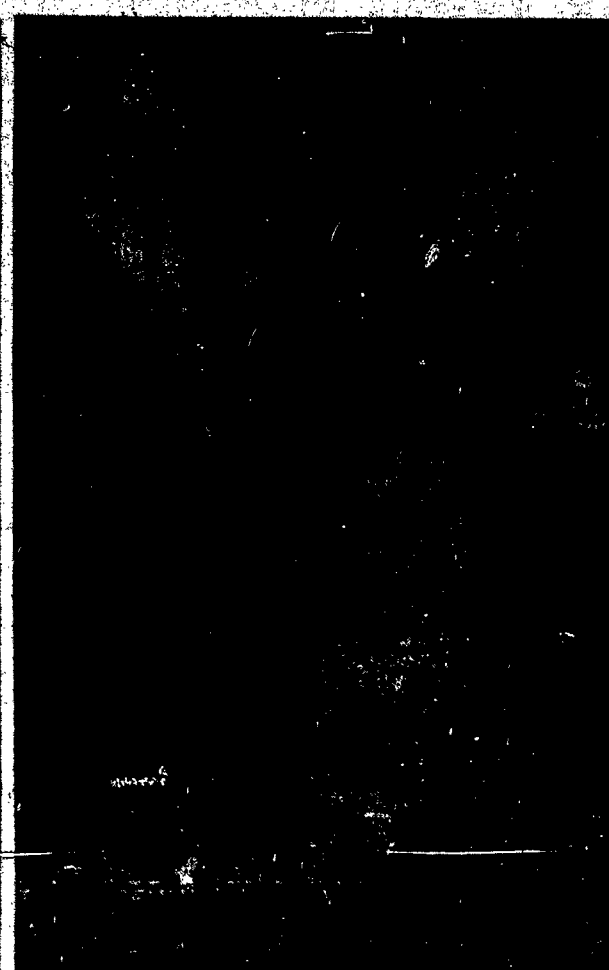
