



No one blames the pione for producing rancous rumblings from unirained fingers. The plane is able to produce thrilling melodies or discordant drivel.

Life is much like the plane. All of us are given life freely. You and I didn't ask to be born. We didn't deserve to be born. But we have this life to use. Life like a plano may produce many off key notes or it may be harmonious according as we are able to use it.

The master who sits at the plane and thrills all by his ability did not come to this in a day, It was accomplished after long, hard years of practice. First he learned music is a great disciplinarian. He could not punch just any key if he hoped to produce a pleasing effect. In the hours of practice he learned that if one followed the rules of music, the result could be beautiful. It could bring true joy to the soul.

Anyone can sit at a plane and produce sound. In some cases it may even be more than just noise. It may be pleasant. But it will be besutiful whether it comes from the trained hand of one who has practiced. long or one who perhaps plays by ear in proportion as it conforms with the basic rules of music.

It is not a great accomplishment, just to be alive. There are times when living is hard, it would be much easier to die,

Southern Baptists Gain In Northeast


