3 Nazareth Students Awarded CDA Grants

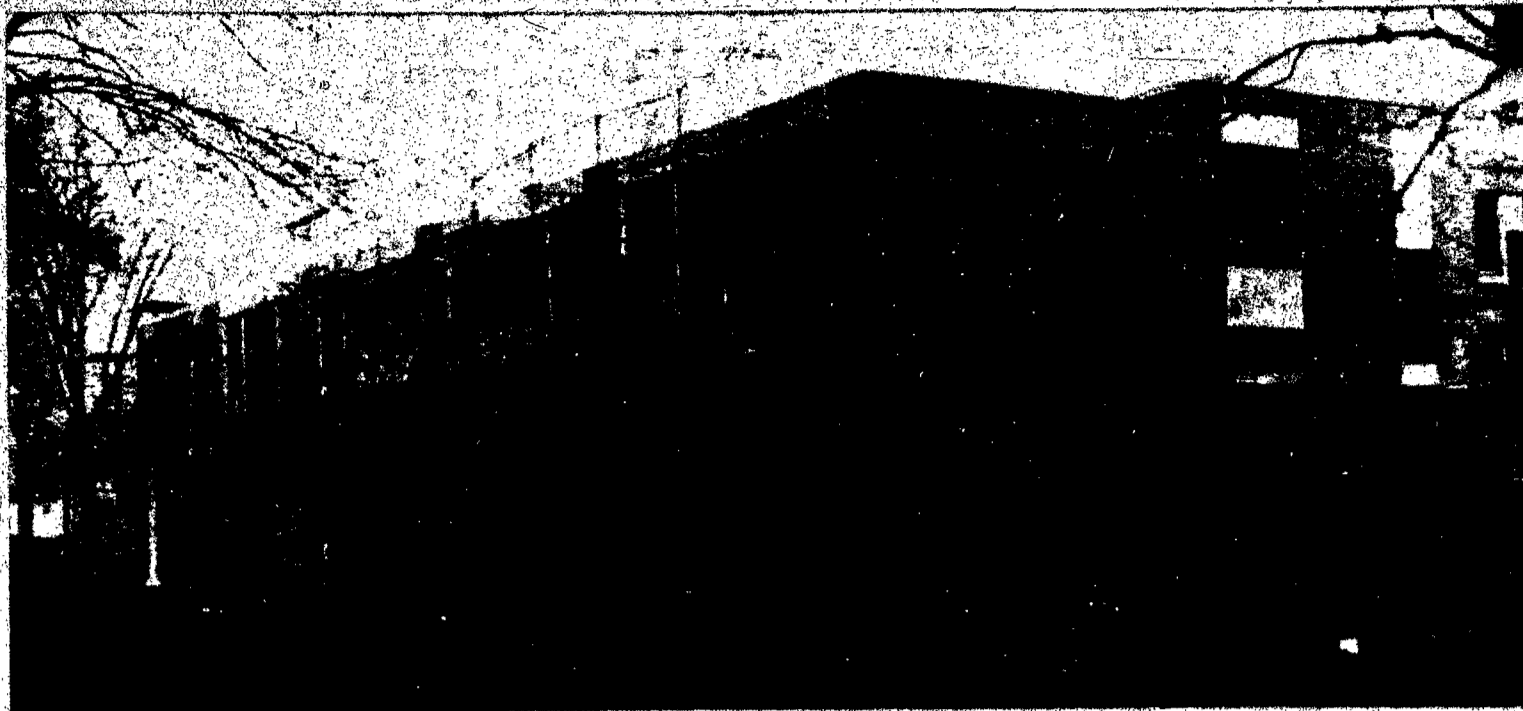

New Post Given Priest Of Negroes

Rev. Robert G. Kreckel, assistant pastor at St. Albanus Church, Auburn, is transferred to Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester, Bishop Kearney announced today.

The appointment is effective Tuesday, Nov. 15, at 6 p.m.

HE SUCCEEDED Rev. Harry Maloney, Josephite Father, who has served in the Rochester parish for three years. Father Maloney's special work as a member of the Society of St. Joseph is the apostolate to Negroes.

During his assignment to the Immaculate Conception Church, he also served as an executive board member of the Rochester National Association for the advancement of Colored People (N.A.A.C.P.), chaplain to the Knights of St. Peter Claver and their Auxiliary and organized the Junior Daughters of the Auxiliary.

He was adviser to the Mother Cabrini Circle which awards scholarships to Negro students.

During the past three years the number of Negro Catholics in Rochester has tripled and includes 850 infants baptized and more than 100 adult converts.

FATHER MALONEY in a farewell statement said, "The Negro people of Rochester, both Catholic and Non-Catholic, have always responded generously in my endeavors to build a better Christian community with them. Father Maloney has been assigned to new duties, not yet made public, by his religious superiors. He will leave Rochester next Tuesday.
