

Parents Role In Child's Vocation Told HN Men

The Role of Parents in the Vocation of their Children was the topic of the talk given by Sister Mary Cyprian at the monthly breakfast of St. Andrew's Parish, Holy Name Society, Sunday, Nov. 13. Sister Cyprian, vice principal of Our Lady of Mercy High School, discussed the most common objections parents make regarding the matter of religious vocations.

CONCERNING THE objection that a daughter is too young to make such an important decision, Sister commented: "She is not too young to be trusted at the wheel of the family automobile, after only a few months of instruction and practice. Yet, lives will depend on her skill, her judgment, her maturity, her self-control. She is not too young to marry that fine young fellow she met a year ago."

"You are proud and happy if your high school age daughter can tell you that she wants to be a nurse, follow a career as a lab technician, or special in research mathematics. These are decisions you welcome. Why not the decision to become a nun?"
