Death claimed two Religious, formerly of this city who served their communities, one in Georgia and the other in Riverdale, N.Y.

Sister Mary Gabriel Moreland (formerly Miss Ignatia C. Moreland) died Nov. 10, 1960, at the Monastery of the Visitation in Atlanta, Ga., at the age of 89.

Sister M. Bernadette, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Emmett Kelly, 301 Sherman St., died at Riverdale, Nov. 13, 1960.

SISTER MARY CARRINI was born in Lindsay, Ontario, and lived in Rochester and Seattle, Washington. She entered the Visitation order in Toledo, Ohio. Several years ago she was one of ten nuns sent from Toledo to Atlanta to establish the first Visitation monastery in Atlanta. Before entering Visitation, Sister Mary Gabriel taught at No. 29 school in Rochester.

She is survived by a niece, Very Honored Mother Mary Helen O'Connell, of the Visitation in Atlanta, and several nieces and nephews in Seattle, San Francisco, and Cleveland. In Rochester she leaves three nieces, Mrs. Joseph G. White, Miss A. Helen O'Connell, and Mrs. Joseph T. O'Connell, and several grand nieces and nephews.

Regular Mass was offered by Rt. Rev. Msgr. Patrick J. O'Connell at the monastery.
