

Elmira Monks Set For Television Feature

New York (NC)—The silent life of Catholic monks will be portrayed over a nation wide television network on the Lamp Unto My Feet series.

The half-hour telecast is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 27, over the Columbia Broadcasting System (Channel 10 in the Rochester area). Lamp Unto My Feet is carried in some areas on a delayed basis.

The first portion of the program will present the story of life in a monastery through scores of penetrating and artistic still photographs. A narrator will explain the practice of the contemplative life in the modern world.

THE PROGRAM'S moderator will then discuss the theory of Catholic monasticism with Father Gregory Borgetti, O.S.B., assistant prior at Mount Saviour Monastery in Elmira, N.Y. The Benedictine monks at Mount Saviour live according to a very austere interpretation of the rule of St. Benedict, one of the founders of monasticism.

The Lamp Unto My Feet series is produced by CSB Public Affairs. The program on monasticism was produced in cooperation with the National Council of Catholic Bishops.

The Young Americans Civics Club of Holy Family School, Rochester, this week received its official charter from the Commission on American Citizenship in Washington, D.C.

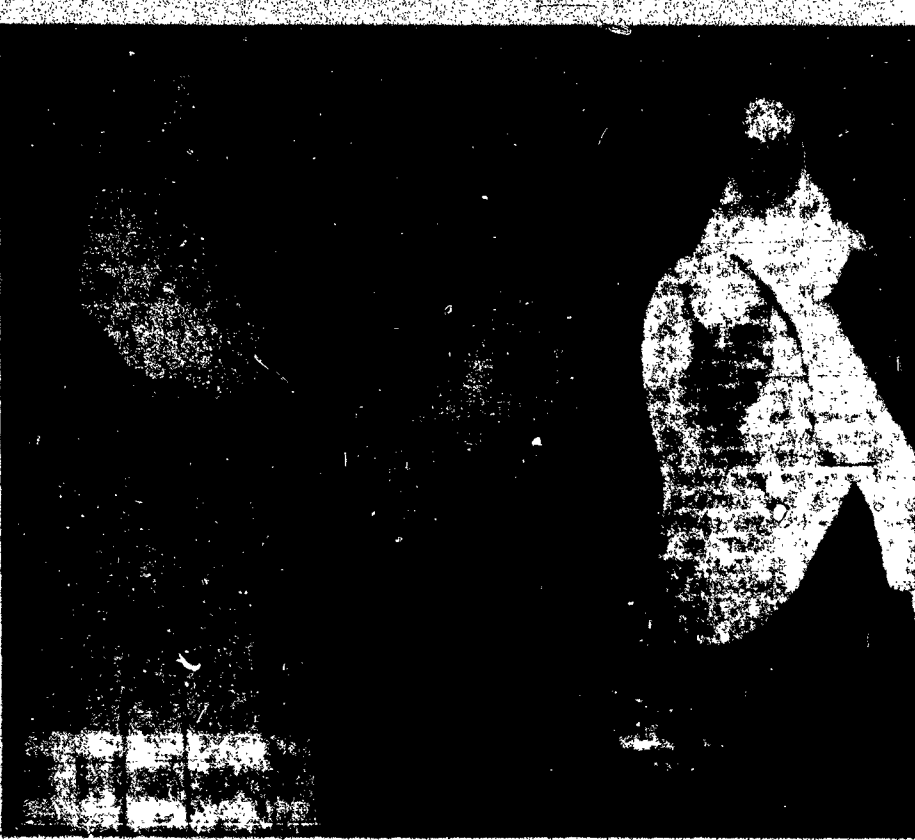
The Charter formally recognizes affiliation of the local unit with the national organization at the Catholic University of America. Pupils of Grade 7 West comprise the local Club membership.
