

## 68 Area CDA Attend Rite

Sixty-eight Catholic Daughters from the Rochester Diocese were among the 1,500 New York State members who joined with more than 7,000 Catholic Daughters of the United States to attend the blessing of five monomial altars at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., on Nov. 12.

Archbishop Patrick A. O'Boyle, Bishop of Washington, presided at the Pontifical Mass celebrated by the Bishop Vincent S. Waters of Raleigh and National Chaplain of the Catholic Daughters.

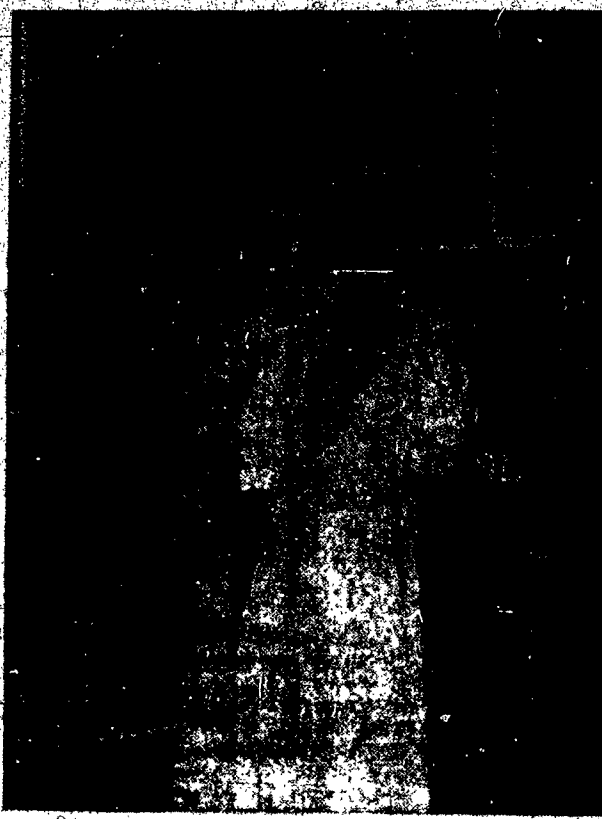
The Men and Boys' Choir of the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament under the direction of Mr. Lawrence E. Fox, sang the Mass.

FORMING THE LINK of church into the Shrine were the National Officers led by Miss Margaret Buckley, Supreme Regent, followed by the State Regents and Vice State Regents, District Deputies, Grand Regents of the Subordinate Courts, Vice-Grand Regents, Monitors, Prophetesses, Historians, Treasurers, Financial Secretaries, Lecturers, and Sentinels. Each member wore the robe symbolizing the office which she holds.

Thirty-eight Knights of Columbus and approximately fifteen hundred Junior Catholic Daughters of America in their green and white uniforms formed a guard of honor.

Miss Margaret J. Buckley, Supreme Regent, was especially honored by the presentation of the Pro Ecclesiae et Pontificis medal bestowed by Pope John XXIII in recognition of her work and the work of the Catholic Daughters of America. Bishop Waters, national chaplain, made the presentation at the foot of the main altar in the National Shrine.

This section included an address on Christian Leadership in a Modern World given by Bishop Waters. The various aspects of leadership were presented by the National Officers.

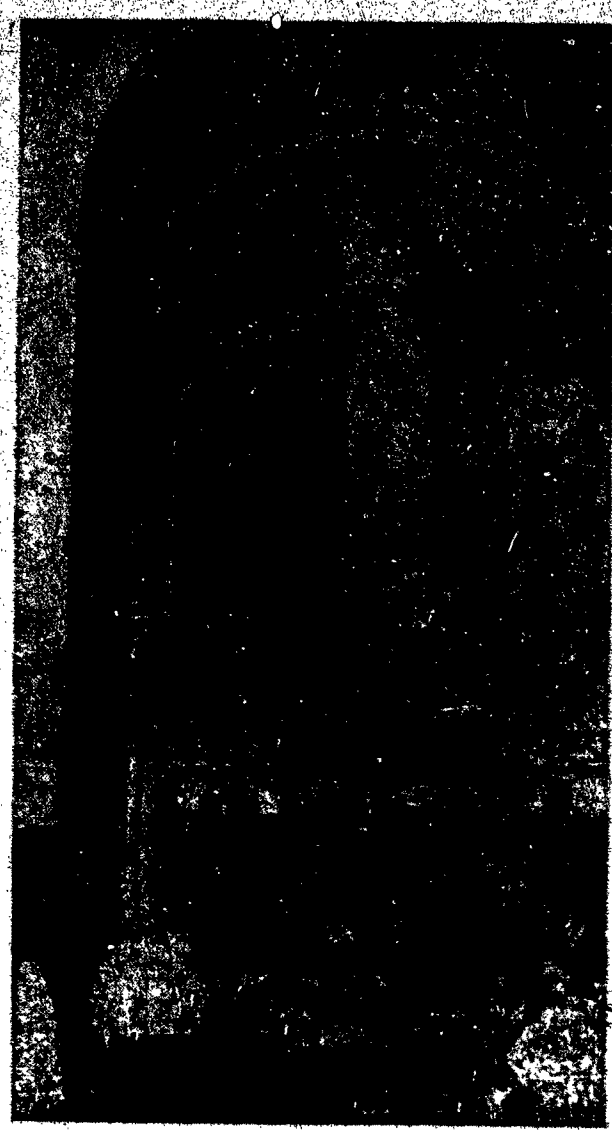
