Corning Knights Hear Watkins Glen Lawyer

Corning—A former Corningite, Attorney Carmichael Miller of Watkins Glen, speaking at a breakfast of members of Corning Council, Knights of Columbus, last Sunday morning, declared that "the association of an attorney with the causes he represents is unwarranted and unjust."

Introduced by Joseph D. Daley, lecturer of Corning Council, Miller addressed about 100 men at the Baron Steuben Hotel. Prayers were offered by the Rev. Thomas P. Brennan, pastor of St. Mary's Church.

THE SPEAKER, a graduate of St. Vincent de Paul's School, Northside High School, Holy Cross College and Georgetown University Law School, discussed the Christmas parties and the Christmas tree in the home of an attorney, which he said, "he knows to be guilty."

"It is the duty of an attorney," he said, "to see that rights are secured the accused. The attorney will urge upon the court and the jury every defense to which an accused person is entitled. He will attack prosecution witnesses as to character and prejudice."

Miller said the legal profession is the oldest in existence and its members are honorable, but the public does not understand the difference between moral guilt and legal guilt, established under law. He warned that continued association of attorneys with causes "would deter proper defense."

Members of Corning Council attended Mass and received Communion at St. Mary's Church. They were escorted by the "uniformed Corning Fourth Degree Assembly."

A day of recollection has been scheduled by the Sacred Heart Ladies Society of St. Anthony's parish, Elmira, to be held on Sunday, Nov. 27.

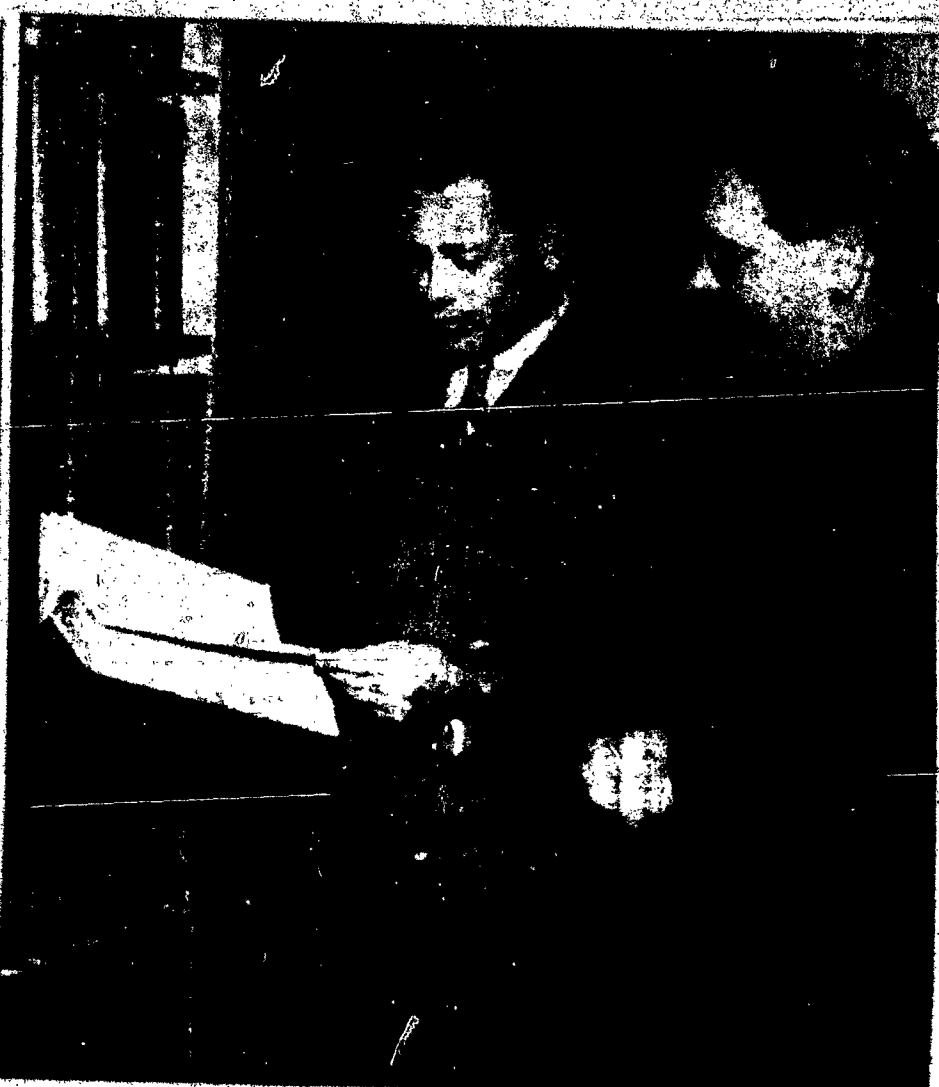

Given \$10,000 Collection

The library of St. John Fisher College has recently been given a large collection of scientific journals by Henry V. Lehmkuhl, president of the Milk Plant Specialties Corporation.

Amounting to approximately 500 volumes, mostly in the fields of chemistry and bacteriology, the collection has been estimated to be worth more than \$10,000 by the college's librarian, the Rev. Frederick A. Black, C.S.B.

THE JOURNALS are in long runs, for the most part dating from the early 1920's, and are splendidly bound. Of particular value to the college is a long run of Chemical Abstracts, a research tool of the first importance, which the library had not previously possessed in complete form.
