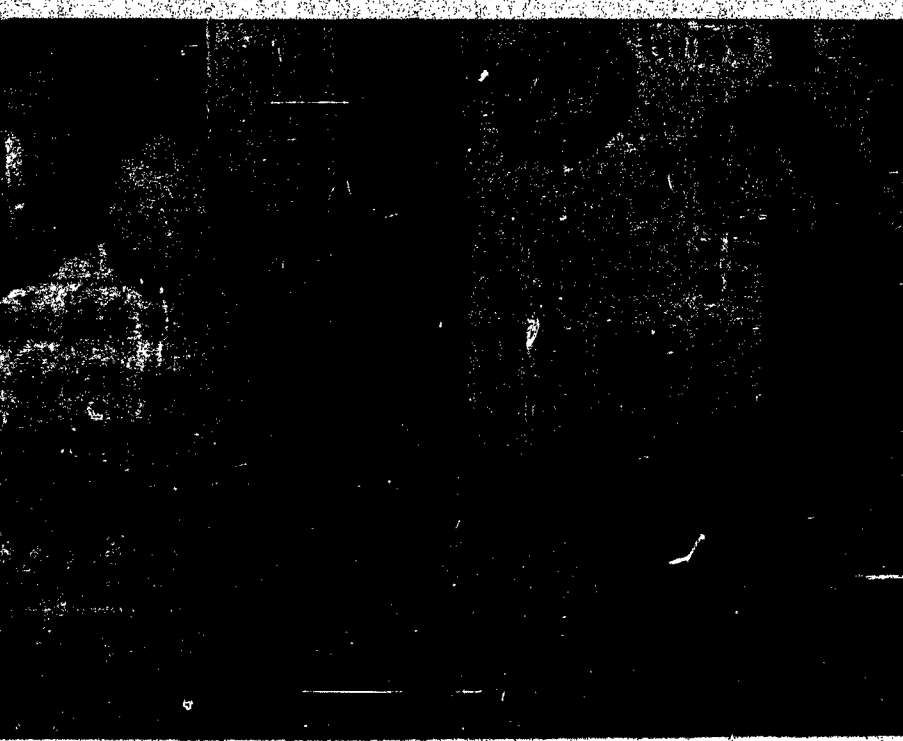

Elmira Monks Set For Television Feature

New York (NY) — The silent life of Catholic monks will be portrayed over a station wide television network on the Lamp Unto My Feet series.

The 15-hour telecast is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 27, over the Catholic Broadcasting System (Channel 10 in the Rochester area). Lamp Unto My Feet is carried in some areas on a delayed basis.

The first portion of the program will present the story of life in a monastery through scenes of generalizing and artistic still-photography. A narrator will explain the practice of the contemplative life in the modern world.

The program's moderator will discuss the theory of Catholic monasticism with Fr. St. Gregory Benedict, O.S.B., assistant prior at Mount Saviour Monastery in Elmira, N.Y. The Benedictine monks at Mount Saviour live according to a very ancient interpretation of the rule of St. Benedict, one of the founders of monasticism.
