**Reds Spur World Youth K of C Film Reveals**

Importance of bringing to the public's attention the "diabolical" program of the Communists involving exploitation of youth of the world to accomplish their political and diplomatic objectives was emphasized by John F. Symonds, New York State Deputy Knight of Columbus. THE WARNING was given at a meeting of state committeemen, this week.  
Referring to the special study of this activity made by the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee, Symonds said: "There is ample testimony that mob violence is a form of pro-Communist warfare for which students from all parts of the world are trained in special schools for International Communist Agents, located in the city of Moscow."  
"Is it a coincidence," he went on, "that the Vice President of the United States was spat upon by rioting students during his visit to South America? Is it coincidental that a similar student demonstration was held in Turkey — and in Korea where it resulted in a change in government — and in Japan where it prevented the President of the United States from setting foot on the soil of a friendly nation, after accepting its invitation to visit? And this week, martial law declared by the government of Haiti because of student riots — and now, bloodshed in Caracas?"  
"On the contrary," Symonds continued, "the techniques used in these demonstrations were all similar to those known to be part of the training given International Communist Agents."  
THE AMERICAN public, by its general apathy toward the alarming advance of world-wide Communism, is inclined to shrug off this evidence by stating that "it couldn't happen here," Symonds indicated that it has happened here.  
He referred to the rioting of American youths at the hearings of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, held in San Francisco in May of this year, which had been reported in the newspapers without emphasis on the full significance of this activity.  
The magnitude of this demonstration, with all its implications, is revealed in a 16 mm sound film which was made at the actual scene of this disturbance. It is indeed frightening, and delivers a warning that should be brought to all of the people of the United States, he said.  
Symonds exhorted those present to effect the distribution of this film which is being made throughout the State of New York under the auspices of the Civic Affairs Committee, of the N.Y. State Council, K. of C., of which Daniel A. Daly, 21 Cherry Tree Road, Loudonville, N.Y., is chairman.  
It is a film that should be shown in every Council, in every school, in every parish, and in every civic organization in the State of New York, Symonds said. The film is available upon application to Chairman Daly, of the Civic Affairs Committee.

**Educators Urge Expert Guidance For Individual**

Sister Helen Daniel, president of Nazareth College, and Sister Saint Catherine, dean of studies, attended the Middle State Secondary Schools Convention in Atlantic City on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 25 and 26.  
The problem presented to the delegates to establish a satisfactory program to enable secondary schools and colleges to work together to help the student, was considered in its various aspects by small discussion groups. Sister Helen Daniel and Sister Saint Catherine attended the eastern regional unit, college and university department, of the National Catholic Educational Association on Saturday.  
The common problem areas of the high school and college such as guidance, curriculum, basic function, entrance requirements, government aid, and other matters were presented for consideration by the attending groups.  
An important conclusion from the west of the conference was the general feeling that more guidance must be paid to expert guidance for the individual student from grammar school through college.
