Study Hints

TV Violence Could Be Factor In Teen Fights

Queens, N.Y.—What effect does television violence have on impressionable teenagers? Perhaps a great deal, a study of the recent teenager "tumult" suggests.

The study, submitted to the office of Queens County District Attorney Frank O'Connor, delved into the backgrounds of 18 Brooklyn and Queens youths who were involved in gang violence in hitherto peaceful neighborhoods.

O'Connor noted that the boys came from homes that were "maritally, occupationally and residually stable." None of them could be described as underprivileged, he said.

He added that the investigation showed no racial or ethnic friction involved in the violence. There were no Negroes in either band. Sectional rivalries were not significant either.

It was learned that the boys were addicted to television, "violent, explicit, private eyes" and action, if ever reading books at home. None of the boys had a library card, although they had maintained fair marks at school.

The investigators found that although the boys' homes were generally of the lower middle class income bracket, many of them had two bale
