Servicer Opened For Scout Program
Sixty top ranking religious, school, civic and fraternal leaders of Rochester and Monroe County were in attendance at the official opening of the new Boy Scout Servicer Tuesday, Nov. 29, where they inspected the new Boy Scout service and administrative facilities.

At a discussion led by Mayor Peter Barry, they were told that Monroe County boy population is growing more rapidly than Scout membership with the result that the percent of boys being served has dropped from 37 percent in 1958 to 33 percent in 1960, and that the Otletiana Council is now staffed and equipped to help in the organization of service of a considerably expanded membership.

OUTCOME of the discussion was a unanimous reaffirmation of belief in the importance of our community of the Boy Scout program of character development as it supplements the home, church and school, and is a need for providing expanded services now available to sponsors through the new Scout Servicer at 474 East Ave. and expanded facilities of the Boy Scout Camps.
