Scout Program

Sixty top ranking religious, school, civic and fraternal leaders of Rochester and Monroe County were luncheon guests of the Otletiana Council, Inc., Boy Scouts of America, at their new East Avenue Servicerenter Tuesday, Nov. 29, where they inspected the new Boy Scout service and administrative facilities.

At a discussion led by Mayor Peter Barry, they were told that Monroe County boy population is growing more rapidly than Scout membership with the result that the percent of boys being served has dropped from 37 percent in 1958 to 33 percent in 1960, and that the Otletiana Council is now staffed and equipped to help in the organization at service of a considerably expanded membership.

OUTCOME OF the discussion was an unanimous reaffirmation of belief in the importance to our community of the Boy Scout program of character development as it supplements the home, church and school, and offers a need for providing more Cub Packs, Scout Troops and Explorer Units for the benefit of our community.

Representatives of the various bodies which sponsor Scouting units agreed to acquaint their membership with the new facilities and expanded services now available to sponsors through the new Scout Servicerenter at 474 East Ave. and expanded facilities of the Boy Scout Camps.
