**Vietnam Gets Native Hierarchy**

Vatican City — (NC) — Pope John has created a hierarchy in Vietnam, the Indochinese nation divided between communist rule in the North and a pro-western government in the South.  
Most of the Catholics formerly living in North Vietnam fled to the South in 1954 and 1955. About a million refugees reached South Vietnam by foot and ship and finally boat during the year and a half that followed the establishment of communist rule in the north. Most of them were Catholics.  
Seventeen of the 19 newly appointed bishops are members of the native clergy. Pope John established three archdioceses and 17 dioceses. One new diocese has jurisdiction over two dioceses.

Hanoi, seat of the communist regime in the North, has become an archdiocese under its former Vicar Apostolic, Bishop Joseph Marie Trinh-nhu-Khuc.  
Saigon, capital of the Republic of Vietnam, has also become an archdiocese. Bishop Paul Nguyen Van Binh, Apostolic of Canho, will head it.

**Shrine On Mountain**

Berbank, Calif. — (NC) — Four thousand pilgrims climbed Mount Raphael here to pray at the shrine built on its crest by St. Francis Xavier Cabrini in 1917. Her feast is Thursday, Dec. 22.  
The pilgrims are members of the Italian Catholic Federation. Mr. Robert E. Brennan, their chaplain, led them in the 15-mile climb of the rain-soaked trail.

**Red Prelate Attends Mass**

Beltsville, Md. — (NC) — Patriarch Alexei of Moscow, head of the Russian Orthodox Church, attended Mass in a Catholic church in Alexandria during his visit to Egypt. It was learned here.  
The Russian Patriarch flew to Alexandria from Moscow on Nov. 25, and was the guest of Orthodox Patriarch Christoforos II of Alexandria for his four-day stay. He attended Mass in the Matiaie White Catholic church in Alexandria on Sunday, Nov. 27.

**Conference-a-Month Recorded For Nuns**

Eaglewood, N. J. — (RNS) — A unique "record-of-the-month" club for English-speaking Catholic nuns throughout the world has been launched here by the Carmelite Fathers Guild.  
Each month, subscribing convents will receive a 12-inch LP record of religious "conferences," transcribed by leading Catholic preachers and retreat masters.  
Cardinals in the Vatican, outstanding members of the hierarchy in the U.S. and Canada, religious writers, missionaries of all Orders have been invited to contribute to the series, according to the Rev. Ronald F. Gray, O. Carm., Guild director.

Rome — (NC) — Germany's Catholics this year will observe the fast and abstinence of the Christmas vigil on December 24, but only until 4 p.m.

**Prelate Recommends**

**At-Home Care For Aged**

Cleveland — (RNS) — A program of in-home care for the nation's aging was proposed here by Mr. Raymond J. Gallagher, national coordinator for Catholic participation in the first White House Conference on Aging, scheduled for Jan. 1961.  
Mr. Gallagher, who is assistant director of Catholic charities for the Cleveland diocese, suggested a parish-level program designed to keep the aging in their own homes as long as is practical.  
"It should be possible," he said, "for one woman to volunteer to see that an elderly woman living alone nearby gets her food. Another woman could supply a case of food once in a while. Still another woman could spend an hour a week cleaning the house or writing letters."  
Such a program of voluntary assistance, he indicated, would reduce the waiting lists at homes for the aged. Mr. Gal-

lagher said many who apply for space in these homes do so not because of immediate need but out of fear there will be no room available when they do require special care.  
THE PRELATE said his proposed program was in harmony with the "principle of subsidiarity," which he believes ought to apply in dividing any system of care for the aged.  
Under this principle, he said, a line of responsibility is established for the custody of aged persons who can no longer care for themselves. First in line is the family, followed by the Church or patriotic associations, and finally the government, beginning at the city or village level and moving up through county, state and then federal agencies.

Commenting on the forthcoming White House Conference, Mr. Gallagher said the 3,000 delegates must help bring back to Americans the "revered patriarch" attitude toward the aging that is rooted in the Bible. He urged delegates representing religious bodies to demonstrate that the influence of religion is not confined to
