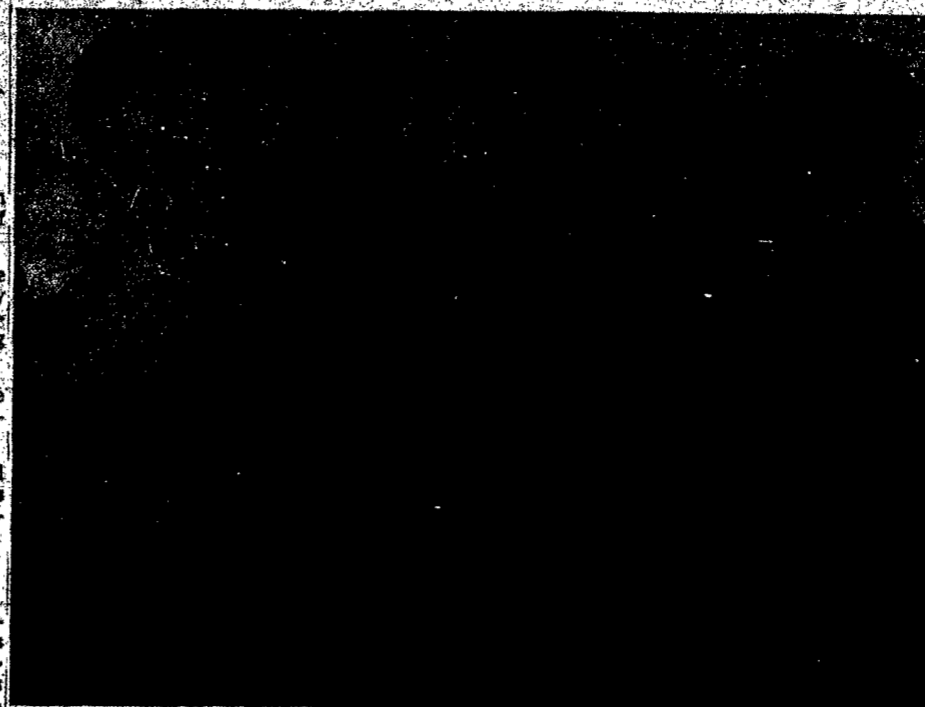

**Oratorical Contest Set By Legion**  
The American Legion's 34th annual oratorical contest, among the high school students of the State of New York, on the subject of the American Constitution and the Bill of Rights, is now being planned according to Theodore A. Busch of Auburn, 7th district chairman. The 7th District comprises the counties of Cayuga, Livingston, Monroe, Otsego, Seneca, Steuben, Wayne and Yates.

Busch also announced that advance information and copies of brochures giving complete details and necessary data for participation in the contest are available to the principals of all central, public and parochial high schools in the eight counties mentioned.

The oratorical contests for the entire State of New York is conducted on the basis of successful eliminations; first by schools, second by counties, third by district and fourth by zones. The winners of the school elimination contests will be eligible to compete for additional prizes in the various county contests to be held during the month of January, 1951.

The winner of each County Contest will be eligible to compete for additional prizes at the District contest to be held during the month of February, 1951, at a time and place to be announced later. The winners of the first and second places in the District Contest will compete for additional prizes in a zone contest to be held also during the month of February.

The winners from each of the five zones in the state will compete for State honors for which the Department of New York will offer winners competing in the final scholarship.

Any eligible student who desires to participate in the contest should immediately contact the Principal of his or her respective school.
