

College Project To Aid Musical

Sophomore art majors at Nazareth College and Rochester's Music Theatre have joined forces for the latter's forthcoming production of Rodgers and Hammerstein's musical "The Sound of Music".

An elaborate ballet sequence called "The Small House of Uncle Thomas" demands the use of a number of strange and difficult-to-produce masks.

MUSIC THEATRE will get its masks — and, in creating them, Nazareth's art students will receive credit in their composition class.

The students, under the direction of art instructor Mrs. Patricia Walsh, are making the masks out of paper mache, silk, old jewelry, pipe cleaners, ribbon and other display and trimming materials.

Based on an Oriental's view of the American west, "Uncle Thomas' Cabin" the ballet project required the students to do preliminary research on art forms used in the East, with special emphasis on Siam, setting of the play.

It is necessary that each mask convey the character to be represented. For example, the wick of "Samson of Lepreux" will wear a three-headed mask with many eyes, topped off by a dragon.

To begin, students made chalk drawings for most of the

characters and the best of each was chosen to be executed.

Masks were made on forms by dipping newspaper strips into wheat paste. They were reinforced with paper tending for a smoother surface. Then dyes and paint were applied.

The image was a replica of the Statue of Our Lady of Luján, patroness of Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay, which arrived in the capital from Buenos Aires aboard a maritime police vessel. It was accompanied by Bishop Amadeo Serafini of Mercedes, the Argentine diocese in which the original statue of Our Lady of Luján is preserved in a national shrine.

Both men served under the Congo Evangelistic Mission, whose headquarters is in Lancaster, England.

Reliable sources said the UN troops had received eye witness reports by tribesmen of how two missionaries were attacked with machetes and put to death near Malaya, a small village about 150 miles from Albertville.

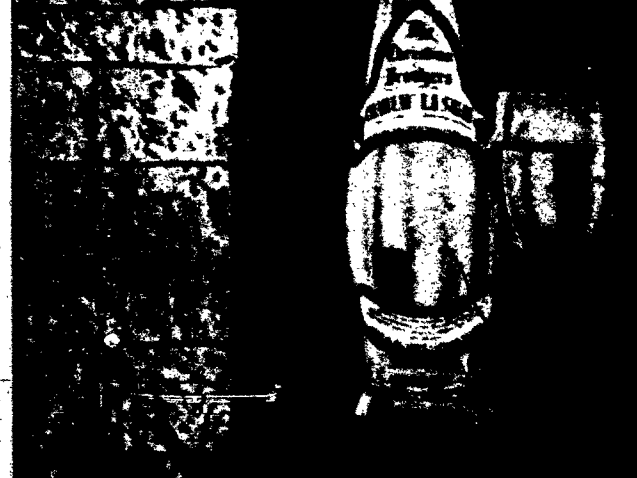

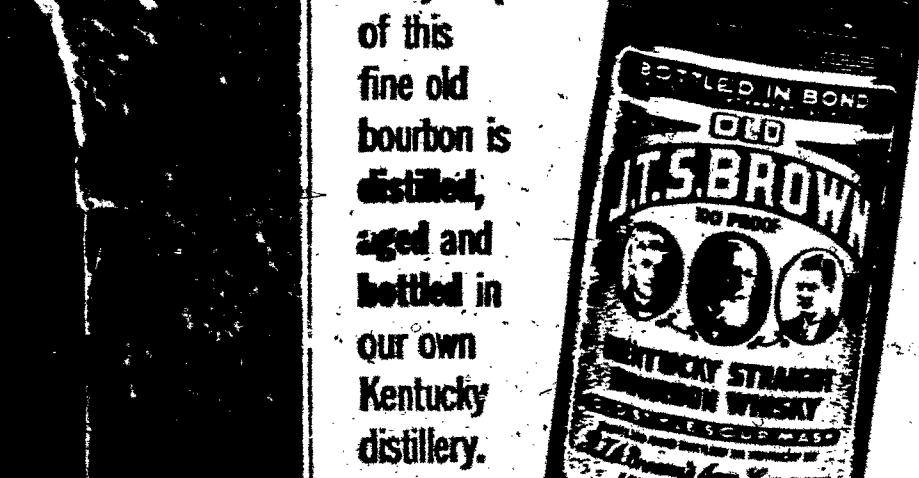

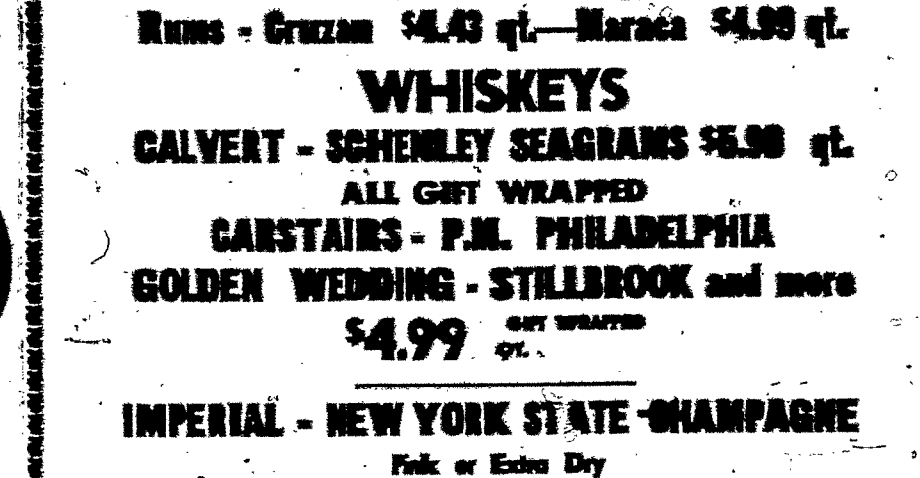
