New Mothers Group**100 Received In Rite
At St. Patrick's, Elmira**

Over 100 members of the recently formed Christian Mothers Confraternity of St. Patrick's parish, Elmira, were solemnly received in a ceremony held recently and conducted by the Rev. Michael C. Hogan, moderator.

Rev. John S. Hayes, pastor addressed the group and stressed the Christian ideals of motherhood, comparing their work with that of the Mother of God.

THE PURPOSE of this organization is the greater sanctification of the members through the Mother of God, to bring them together to discuss their related problems as mothers.

They also help furnish various aids necessary for the Sisters in the operation of the school. This year the Christian Mothers have as their project the equipping of the Visual Aid Room.

The minimum goal of \$100,000 was overreached by 25%.

Purposes of the appeal were to raise the funds necessary for the erection of a new Parish Center and the conversion of the school basement into an area suitable for eight classrooms.


