Radio Mass

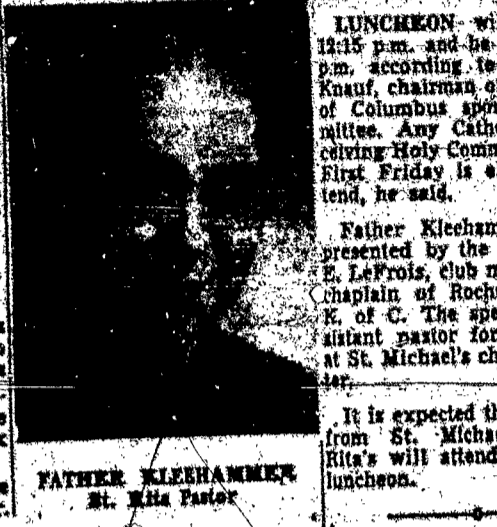
High Mass on New Year's Day will be broadcast by radio station WHAM from St. John's Church, Greece, 11 a.m. to noon.

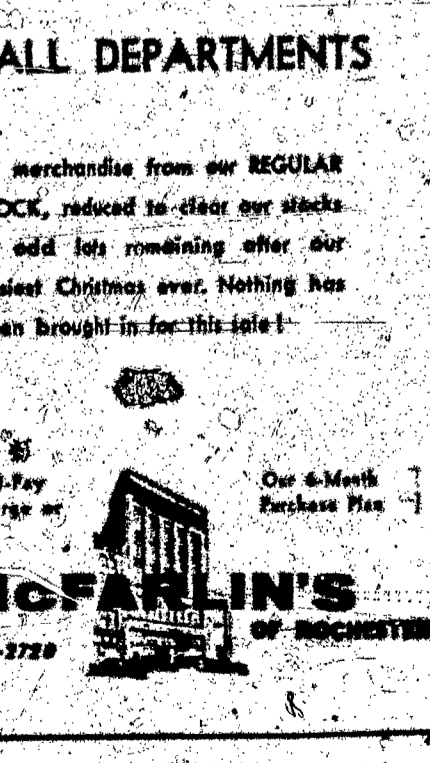
