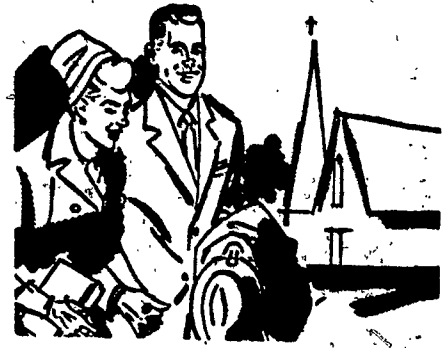

It is true that the Church will be sustained in the virtue of the Divine Promises, but the signs point to great disasters approaching nations and souls. The Chair of Unity Octave is made to order for this purpose. It does not aim merely at restraining the evil, but at converting the world to Christ's true church."

The evening's highlight was Father Chester M. Klocek's talk on the convention of the National Council of Catholic Women which he attended last November in Las Vegas, Nevada. Father Klocek said the primary object of the convention was to encourage the women of America to dedicate themselves to the political, social, and educational fields in order to bring to these various fields of American life high ideals and virtue. However, the convention was geared to the woman who is a mother, because "most of the women exercise their social role primarily in the home where their wise guidance and maternal love prepare their children to make their own contributions to society, the nation, the Church, and to the greater honor and glory of God. In other words, the efforts of every Catholic woman is intended to make our American homes truly Christian."

After the meeting Father Klocek showed 172 color slides of the scenes that he captured during his tour of the Far West. Among the scenes of interest were 15 of the 21 Spanish missions which were founded by the Franciscan padres.
