Stay-at-home Pilgrimage

Parish groups interested in a "stay-at-home" pilgrimage can have a trip to Oberammergau delivered to them by St. Bernard's Seminary professor Father Robert McNamara.

He has an extensive series of slide pictures of this past summer's Passion Play at the famed Bavarian village.

This was his fourth visit there.

HIS INTEREST in the three centuries dramatic spectacle dates to his childhood when he read travelogues by John L. Stoddard.

The Oberammergau play has been performed every ten years since 1634 in thanksgiving for the end of a plague which hit the village the year before. Only war has interrupted the schedule since then.

Father McNamara knew Anton Lang, who played the role of Christ in 1900, 1910 and 1922, and Alois Lang, who took the role in 1930 and 1934.

In his visits there, Father McNamara has been a guest of the Rendl family who also have a long family tradition of participation in the drama.

The play was originally intended as a local act of devotion but in the past 100 years has attracted world-wide attention and brought thousands to view it.

Chinese Artist's Work Exhibited At Nazareth

The art department of Nazareth College is currently holding an exhibition of the works of the Chinese artist, Ou Mie, Shu. The exhibition includes oils and watercolors, some of which are in the traditional oriental idiom, but all of which breathe the contemporary spirit.

OF HIS WORK, Mr. Ou says, "Traditionally, Chinese painting deeply involves music, calligraphy (brushwriting), and poetry." Among the pictures hung at Nazareth is one of the Sea of China between Quemoy and Matsu. This is an area well known to the artist, as Mr. Ou was an officer under Chiang Kai Chek on Formosa.

Mr. Ou has been in the United States for two and a half years, and will receive his M.A. from the University of Notre Dame, in February. In addition to his work in painting, Mr. Ou has earned a degree in law, and a degree from the Military Academy in Taiwan. He is also interested in music, and studied both violin and piano in the National Shanghai Music School.

Mr. Ou's work has been exhibited in China and Formosa, and he has also had two one-man shows in the United States. Nazareth's showing of his work will continue at the college through the middle of February. Visitors are welcome to view the exhibition from 9 to 5 o'clock, Monday through Saturday. The college is also hoping to arrange a personal visit from Mr. Ou, sometime during February.
