

# Bona Downs Duquesne

In the "big" double header of the season in the Buffalo Auditorium, St. Bona defeated Duquesne 89-78 and Canisius withstood Seton Hall to win 78-74.

The Bonnies used magnificent shooting (59%) a 1 passing to defeat the well-balanced Duques who had won seven of their first eight. The windup was an exciting contest in which neither team could gain more than a 4 point advantage in the

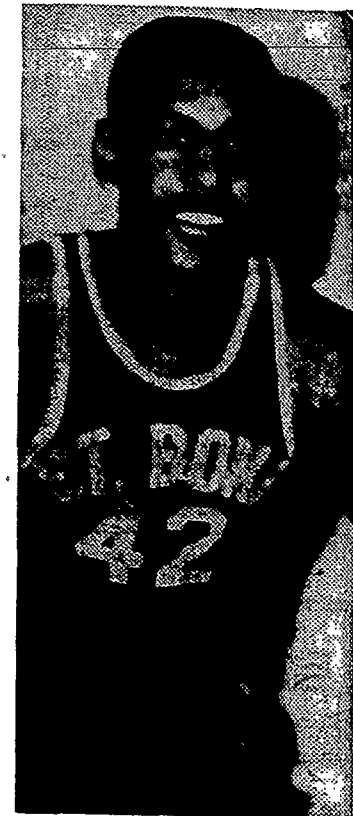

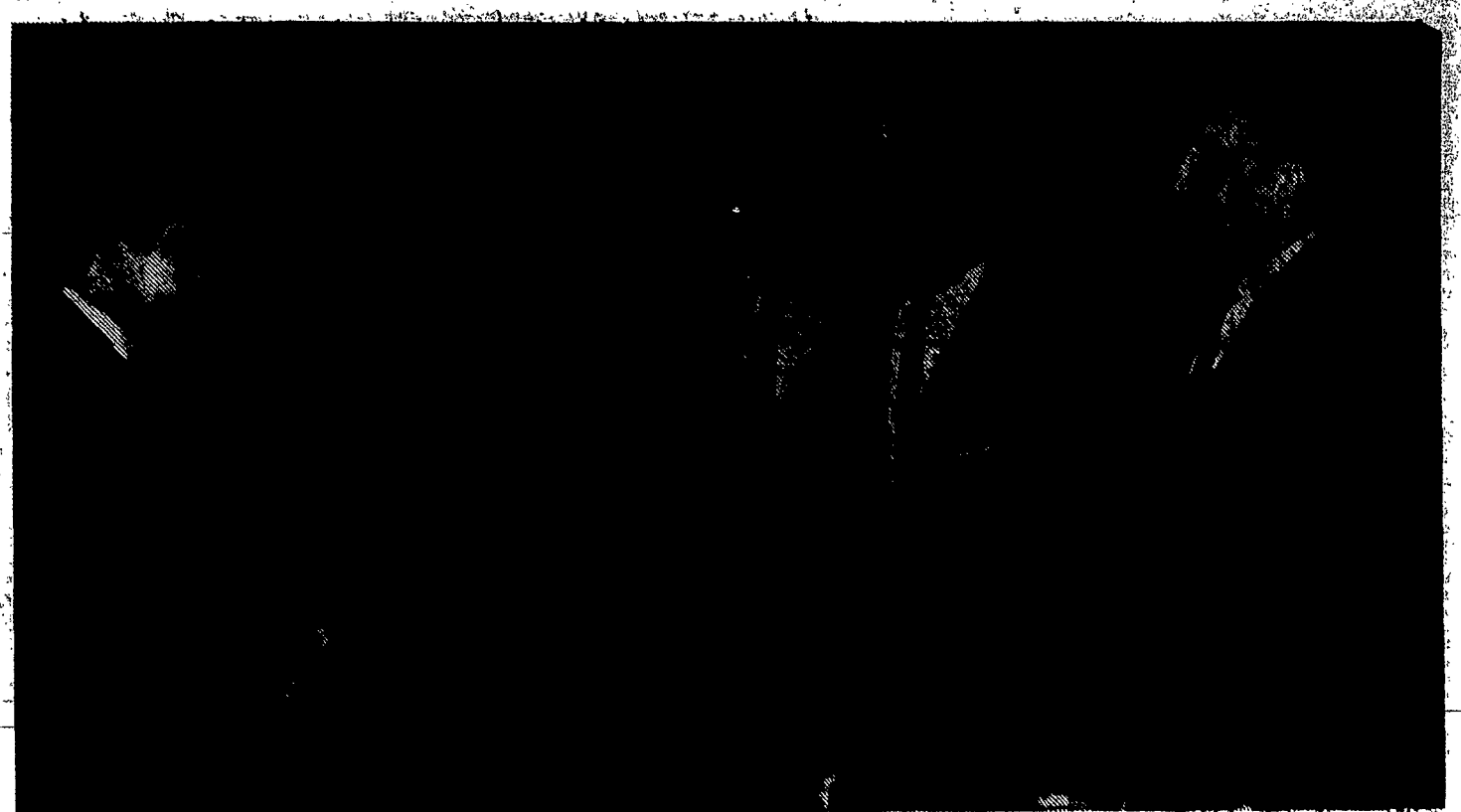
