Robert J. Murphy's funeral Mass was offered in St. Monica Church on Saturday, Jan. 7, Mr. Murphy, of 1035 Genesee St., twice Democratic candidate for sheriff and a past commander of Monroe County American Legion died Jan. 4, 1961 in his home. He was 66.

Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by the Very Rev. Msgr. Joseph J. Sullivan assisted by the Rev. Thomas C. Kane, deacon and the Rev. Gerald E. Dunn, subdeacon.

Mr. Murphy was a member of the Holy Name Society of St. Monica's Church. A veteran of World War I he was the first commander of Smith-Warren Post, American Legion in Scottsville. He was elected county commander in 1928.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Helen Murphy; two sons, Sheridan and Robert King; one brother, William Murphy of Scottsville.
