**Marshall McLuhan Talk Scheduled At Fisher**

Dr. H. Marshall McLuhan will deliver the fourth lecture in the series of Discussion Forums at St. John Fisher College, on Friday, Feb. 3, at 10:30 a.m. His address is entitled "The New Media and the New Education," and will be followed by a general discussion. It will be given in the Rosina Kearney Auditorium, and is open to the public.

The lecturer is a leading figure in the field of modern media of communication, as well as a noted teacher, author and lecturer. He holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Manitoba and Cambridge University, and obtained his doctorate in English from Cambridge.

He has taught in the graduate and undergraduate schools of Winconsin University, St. Louis University, and Assumption University of Windsor. For the past fourteen years he has been teaching at St. Michael's College in the University of Toronto where he is professor of English.
