Father Ostas Marks Jubilee

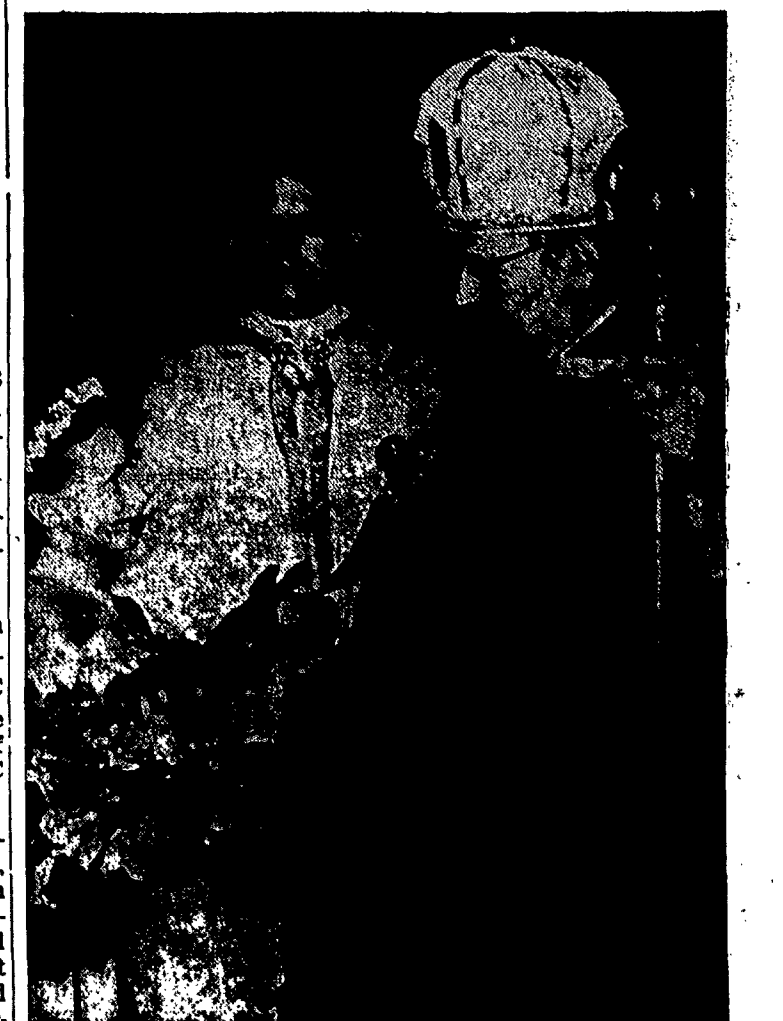
Auburn — Parishioners of SS. Peter and Paul Church will honor their pastor, the Rev. Basil Ostas on his silver jubilee Sunday, Feb. 12. This will also mark his 16th year as pastor at SS. Peter and Paul Church.

Fr. Ostas was ordained to the priesthood by the late Metropolitan Archbishop Andrew Sheptytsky, OSBM, Feb. 15, 1936, in Lviv, Ukraine. He came to this country after Ukraine was occupied by Russian Communists in 1942. At first he was assigned as an assistant pastor at the Immaculate Conception Cathedral in Philadelphia, Pa. Shortly after he was appointed pastor in Centralia, Pa.

Fr. Ostas with the assistance of the Rev. Peter Ohirko, plans to build a new convent in the spring, and to extend the present SS. Peter and Paul School.

Fr. Ostas will celebrate a Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, Feb. 12, at 9:30 a.m. He will be assisted by visiting priests. After Mass he will bestow a special blessing and distribute holy cards for remembrance to all present.

A congratulatory letter from Bishop Ambrose Senyshyn, OSBM, from Stamford will be read by Very Rev. Basil Seredovich, dean, from Syracuse.
