All den leaders, scout workers and council workers and council members are invited.

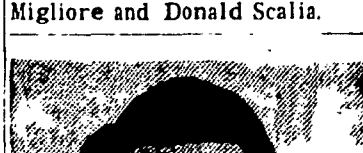
