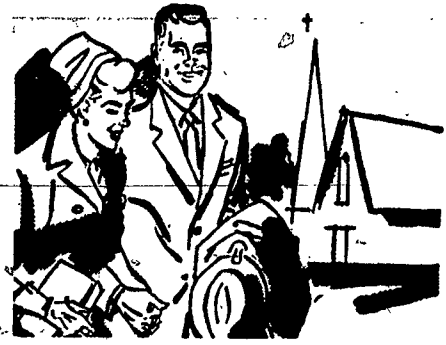


### Church Rites With Brogue

Dublin — (RNS) — Use of the vernacular in certain rites of the Roman Catholic Church in Ireland has come into general acceptance in this predominantly Catholic country.

Although Latin will be retained in the Mass and in administration of the Church's sacraments, English and Gaelic are being used in many prayers of the rites for Baptism, Matrimony, and Extreme Unction.
