Father Whitley, a member of the Catholic Book Week committee, directed the publication of an annotated list of the best in Catholic reading for young adults.

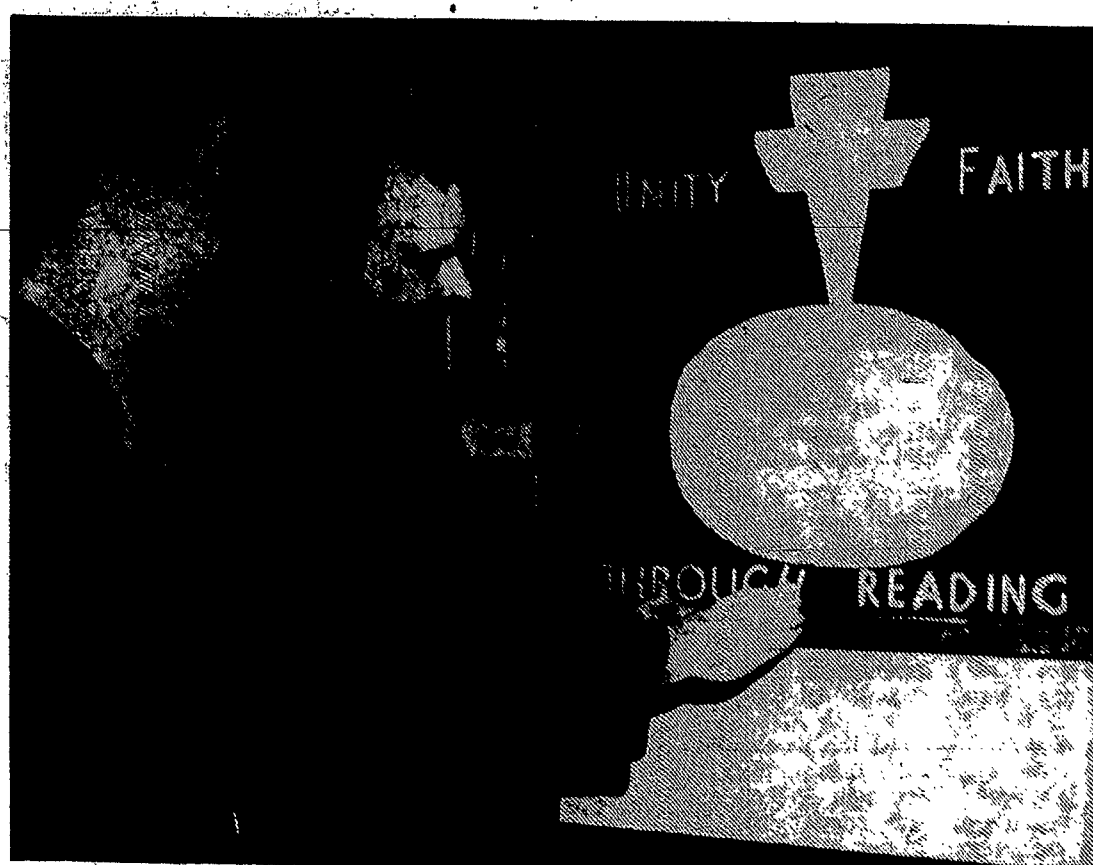
## Rosary Hill Dean's List

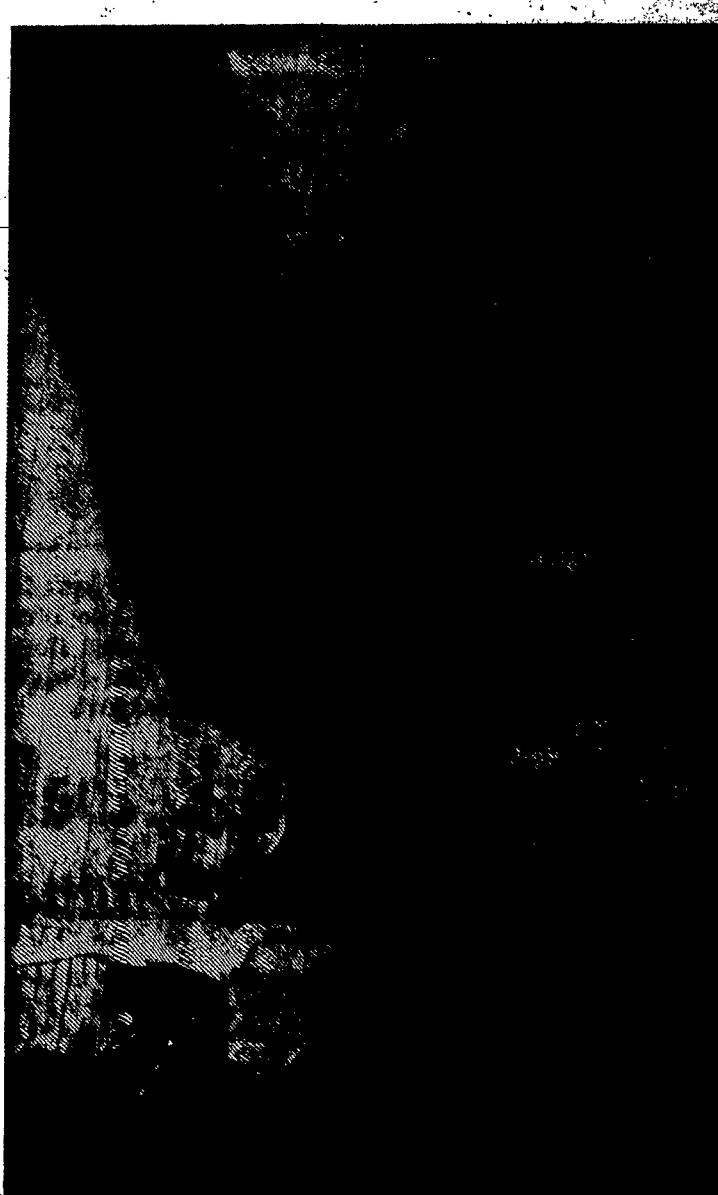

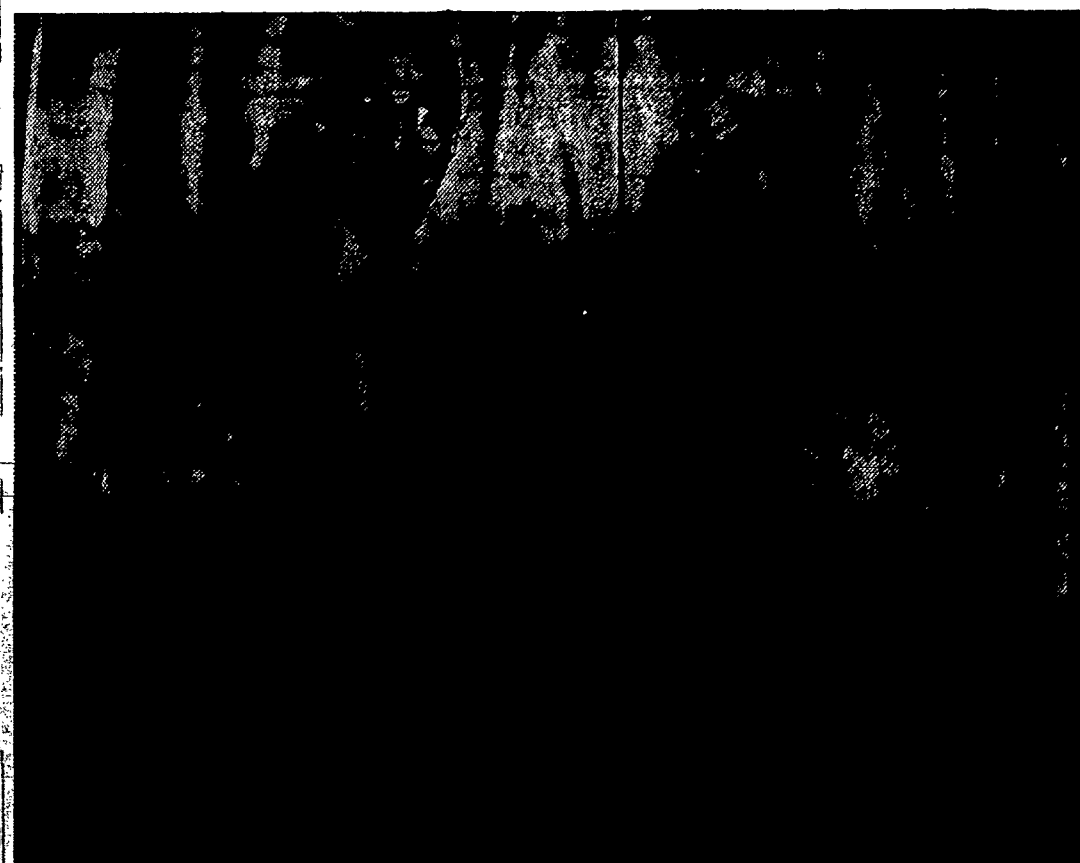
