## St. Mary's Parishioners To Hear Passionists

Auburn—Rev. Maurice Sullivan, C.P. and the Rev. Kieran Richardson, C.P. were appointed to conduct a Mission at St. Mary's Church, Auburn, beginning on Sunday, Feb. 19, according to an announcement made at the Masses on Sunday, by the Rev. Msgr. James D. Cluffney, V.F.

**THE FIRST WEEK** will be for the women and high school girls and will begin at 7:30 on Sunday evening. The second week will be for the men and high school boys and services will be held beginning Sunday evening, Feb. 26 at 7:30. The Mission will close on March 5.

Both Father Sullivan and Father Richardson served as Army Chaplains. Father Sullivan was with the 1st Cavalry Division in the Philippines, South Pacific and occupation of Japan serving from 1943 until 1946 when he returned to the Passionist Mission Band to conduct retreats and missions. He was recalled to the Army and 1st Cavalry Division for duty in Korea from 1950 until 1953. Father Sullivan was ordained in Baltimore, Md. on April 23, 1950 by Archbishop Michael Curley.

He completed his studies for the priesthood at St. Michael's Seminary in Union City, New Jersey and was ordained there on May 30, 1936. Father Richardson served as a missionary in China from 1939 to 1947, serving as chaplain with the Army in China from 1943 to 1945. He served as a parish priest at the Passionist Church at Jamaica, L.I., N.Y., until his assignment in 1960 to the Mission Band.
