Mr. Peisher retired on March 15, 1938, after fifty years of service.

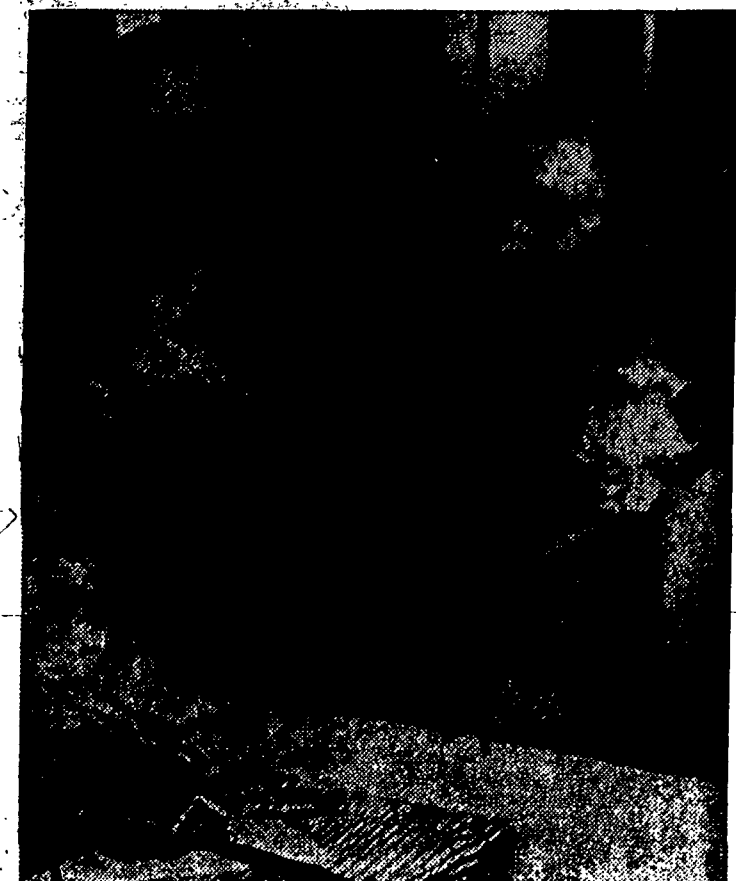

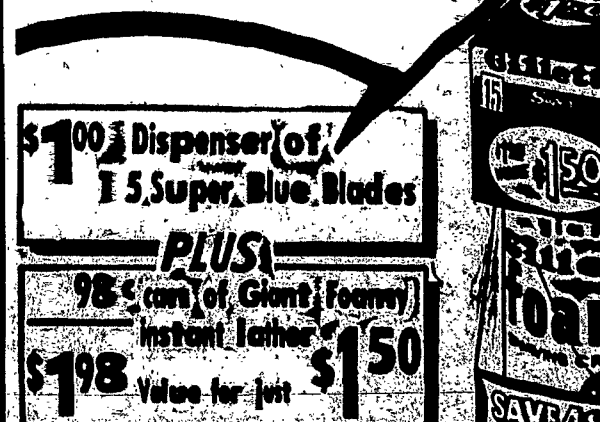
