### Fisher Tops RBI In First Game

The Cardinals, Saint John Fisher College's newly organized varsity basketball team, climaxed their first home game on Saturday, Feb. 18, with an 82 to 79 victory over Rochester Business Institute. The close, fast-paced game was played at the East Rochester Junior High School.

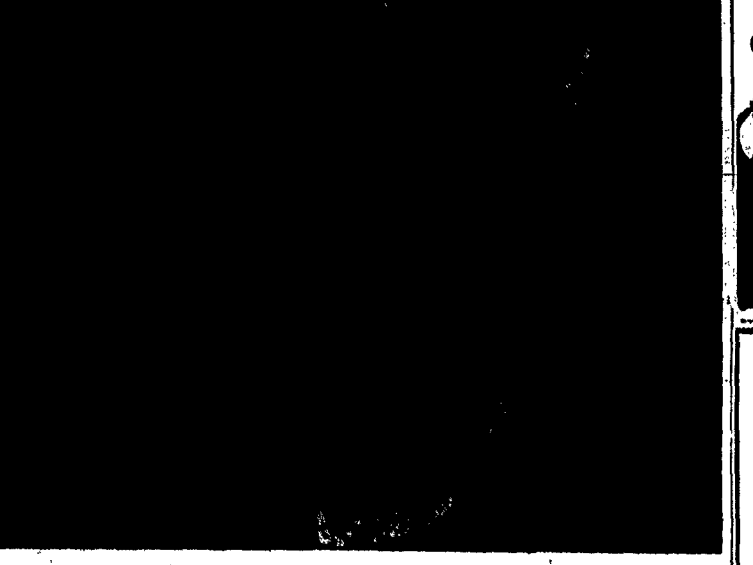
