Theatre News

Current Plays

BYE, BYE BIRDIE—Bouncing caricature — or is it? — of Rock 'n Roll and teenagers swooning over Konrad Birdie. Chita Rivera is his secretary, Dick Van Dyke, his press agent, Slick, quick and mostly funny.

FIORIELLO — Vivid picture with music of Mayor La Guardia and his times. Directed by George Abbott, it deserves its three awards — Pulitzer, Critics, Tony.

GYPSY — Ethel Merman, as the mother of June Havoc and Gypsy Rose Lee, exploits her little girls lustily in Act I. In Act II, Rose is pushed into a strip tease and raw Minsky. Not recommended.

MY FAIR LADY — Still very much alive with almost complete change of cast.

THE BEST MAN — Cracking exposition of behind-the-scenes politics with Melvyn Douglas and Frank Lovejoy as rather recognizable candidates and Lee Tracy as the ex-president who loves "a good dirty fight." Gore Vidal, the author, evidently means the title to be inside quotation marks.

THE MIRACLE WORKER — How Anne Sullivan, played by Anne Bancroft, teaches the meaning of language to Helen Keller as a child, played by Patty Duke, is the miracle for every one to see.

THE SOUND OF MUSIC — Miss Mary Martin has established the Trapp family on Broadway. Seats now selling for 1961.

THE TENTH MAN — Paddy Chayevsky at his best in the drama of the young girl possessed by an evil spirit and saved by the nine old men in the Synagogue in Mineola.

TOYS IN THE ATTIC — Tragedy of two devoted spinster sisters who ruin their brother, by Lillian Hellman, as brilliant as it is unwholesome. Finely acted.

OFF BROADWAY
HERE COME THE CLOWNS — Strong revival of Philip Barry's drama on the problem of evil in which some bedraggled vaudeville troupers in a bar room discover an answer — FREE WILL.

LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE — Charming amusing "take-off" of the Romberg-Friml operettas with beguiling music, rapid action and Mary Brennan.

THE BALCONY — Phantasmagoria by Genet, produced with Jose Quintero's best still — surrealistic, obscene and impossible.

THE FANTASTICS — Modern version of Rostand's LES ROMANESQUES, orchestrated with a piano and harp, attractive music, witty lyrics, unusual staging. Rich in humor and charm.

BECKET — Anouilh's disappointing play which opens some seven years before MURDER IN THE CATHEDRAL. Neither Sir Laurence Olivier nor Anthony Quinn give the essence of the characters, nor does Anouilh. King Henry is a boor and Thomas more cynic than saint. A dialogue between the Pope and a Cardinal is low comedy. But the production in itself is splendid.

DRUMS UNDER THE WINDOW — Paul Shyre's third adaptation of Sean O'Casey's autobiography in which Marty Green is delightful as Narrator. The scenes this time are acted out but the subject matter is less interesting than the rhythms of the prose.

MIKE NICHOLS & ELAINE MAY — Two very clever night club comedians whose material is for the most part inferior to their talents.

A TASTE OF HONEY — Tragic in that it is written by a girl of nineteen, the pitifully offensive story is superbly played by Angela Lansbury and Joan Plowright.

TENDERLOIN — Musical founded on Dr. Parkhurst's crusade against vice in 1892. Maurice Evans is not very convincing as Dr. "Brook" Messrs. Abbott and Weidman use him as an excuse for Tenderloin visits which get boring in spite of Cecil Beaton sets and costumes. Dull and unsavory.

THE FACE OF A HERO — Jack Lemmon, forsaking Comedy, in a confused and poorly written drama about justice in a southern town. Superior cast.

THE FORTY-NINTH COUSIN — Pleasant little Jewish comedy with the irritable Menasha Skulnik.

MONSERRAT: Translated by Lillian Hellman from the Spanish horror-drama by Emmanuel Robler, it had a brief run with Emlyn Williams in 1949. Set in Venezuela in 1812, Monserrat is an officer who helped Bolivar escape and who refuses to betray him even when the price is to see six innocent people, four women and two men, shot down before him. The GATE THEATRE presents this grimly frustrating tragedy with its usual actumen and elegance but not even its good cast can make it a good play.

What Teenagers Think About The 'Courier'
