Episcopal Laity Criticize Prelate

San Francisco — (RNS) — About 100 lay members of the Protestant Episcopal California diocese issued a statement here critical of Bishop James A. Pike for his comments in a recent magazine article expressing "disbelief" in the Virgin Birth of Christ.

According to a spokesman for the group, Mrs. Germaine McCormack of Orinda, some 1,000 copies of the statement were mailed to congregations in the diocese which is headed by Bishop Pike.

SHE SAID the lay organization has no officers and is called "Episcopallians for the Faith." The group's statement is headed: "Is Bishop Pike undermining our Christian faith?"

Following appearance of the magazine article by Bishop Pike in a December issue of Christian Century, undenominationalist

weekly, he was charged with heresy by a group of Episcopal ministers in Georgia. He has denied these charges in a prepared statement and at a meeting of his diocese where he received a unanimous vote of confidence.

Bishop Pike has declared that he firmly believes in the doctrine of the Virgin Birth insofar as it related to the dual nature of Jesus, but was "agnostic" when it came to a literal belief in the historic details. He has stated that the Virgin Birth is a "myth" which churchmen should be free to accept or reject.

Michigan Public School Bible Classes Disputed

Williamston — (NC) — A dispute has opened here over the practice of permitting Protestant ministers to give Bible instruction in public schools during school hours.

The office of State Atty. Gen. Paul L. Adams has been requested to give an opinion on the legality of a program run by the Rural Bible Mission of Kalamazoo.

RESIDENTS of this 2,200-resident community are split on the legality and propriety of the practice begun several years ago in this general area, but in Williamston itself only this year.

Members of the Rural Bible Mission staff visit public schools in more than 34 rural Michigan counties, teaching an estimated 60,000 elementary pupils.

Debt Eliminated At St. Vincent's

Corning — A financial record was accomplished at St. Vincent de Paul's parish, with a church debt of \$267,702.87 being wiped from the books.

The debt figure represents payment for a new church and rectory, and a much-enlarged school during that time.

Announcement of the figures was made a week ago during Masses, with an explanation that loans totaled \$250,000, while the interest paid was an additional \$22,702.87. The Rev. Joseph Guilfoil, parish pastor, reported on the financial status of the parish.

Father Guilfoil took over St.

Vincent's pastorate in 1940, when the debt of the parish totaled \$12,208. That was paid off, with interest, in 1942.

"We are grateful to all who gave their support to the church," Father Guilfoil told his parishioners. "They may rest assured that the Infant of Prague and Our Blessed Lady of Victory — under whose patronage we have placed and continue to do so our efforts — will bless them for their co-operation. That God may bless everyone is our prayerful wish."
