C.Y.O. Basketball Roundup

St. Thomas won their first grammar school league championship by beating St. Charles last Sunday 47-24 to clinch the White division title. Immaculate Conception wrapped up the title in the grammar green division with a sound trouncing of St. Boniface, 35-14. Mother of Sorrows, St. Monica's, Sacred Heart and Holy Cross will join champion St. Thomas in the upcoming CYO Diocese tournament on March 17-18-19th.

In the Green division Mt. Carmel, St. Thomas More and Our Lady Lourdes will enter the tourney along with league winners Immaculate Conception. Only a partial schedule remains in the Green division and a full slate of games in White loop with the feature game St. Thomas vs. St. Monica's taking place this Sunday. Actually the game has no bearing on the championship since St. Thomas wrapped it up but St. Monica's who finished second would like to break off the champs.

IN THE HIGH SCHOOL Northern division three teams finished their regular season tied for first place, Mother of Sorrows, Sacred Heart and Holy Cross. This Sunday, Sacred Heart faces Holy Cross at a site to be determined while Mother of Sorrows draws the bye and will play the winners on Wednesday, March 5. The winner of this game will be crowned league champions and the loser from next Sunday's game and the loser from the Wednesday night's game play Sunday, March 12, to determine the second place team and the big tournament berth.

High School Southern division finds St. Helen's still clinging on to the first place spot with St. Monica's still to play two make up games with Holy Ghost and Blessed Sacrament and both could mean trouble for the Mustangs. A playoff will be played March 12 in the event of a tie in this loop, with a full slate of action scheduled for this Sunday. St. Helen's plays Holy Trinity this Sunday and at least a sure tie for the championship.

Aquinas To Defend Title McQuaid Cagers Bid For Tourney Crown

Tomorrow night is the big night!

Aquinas meets McQuaid at the Community War Memorial in the first round of the Diocesan Catholic High School basketball tournament.

Both teams have held closed-door practice sessions all week in preparation for this annual classic.

McQuaid's hopes were dimmed somewhat early this week when it was reported that their leading scorer Frank Zona suffered a muscle sprain in his foot, however Coach George Monagan says he should be in action tomorrow night but will miss vital practice drills.

McQuaid sports an impressive 12-6 record this season with big wins over Madison High of the Interscholastic league and a strong Xavier team of New York City.

Aquinas has experienced record-wise a rough season coming up with a 7-10 mark and their first losing season in many years. The Irish faced eight unbeaten teams this year with a team that has lacked the big scoring punch.

McQuaid's leading scorer is Junior Frank Zona who has been averaging 15 pts. per game. Following close behind are back-court men Tommy Tisa and Richie Ide, two of the best in the business.

Junior Tony Criscuolo who has surprised many with his timely shooting and Denny Williams, a fine rebounder who gets his share of the scoring.

McQuaid has excelled with their aggressive defensive play this year holding the opposition to 50 points per game.

A good ball moving team on offense, they take advantage of their opponents' miscues and strike with amazing speed with clever ball handling and consistent shooting.

Aquinas has good scoring potential in Jim Chatterton, who has been averaging 12 pts. per game along with floor-general Roger La Force who can move to his left or right with remarkable speed and has good fakes.

Gary Page, a fine ball handler and back court man likes that long shot from way out and will hurt you with his sudden drive for the basket. Norb Keller is very aggressive underneath and will make his shots from either

side. John Affronti has a good jump shot from the outside and has a fairly good percentage of accuracy.

Doug Kane and Ed Calvaruso are two good juniors who need more experience to help this year. Aquinas has a definite height advantage that once position is maintained they should own the boards.

Defensively McQuaid employs with much success a man to man type defense that requires much speed, it would appear that this particular defense against Aquinas would need such speed because the Irish can move quick.

A slight edge is given to the Knights on their defense established by their good record. In shooting, McQuaid has a substantial edge in good scorers like Frank Zona, Richie Ide and Tom Tisa. An off night for these lads and the McQuaid team could face serious trouble. Inexperienced bench and shooting worries could hurt Aquinas badly. Relying on their height to off set any scoring blitz Aquinas should make it very interesting for the Knights.

Coach Ron Mack's cagers have two big wins under their belts in this basketball festival and McQuaid must win that "first" big one. An expected 8,500 fans will be at the War Memorial to find out just what will happen.

On Sunday, March 5 the tournament has a full slate of games. Mt. Carmel of Auburn, considered by many as the dark horse in the tourney faces DeSales of Geneva at Auburn in an afternoon game scheduled to start at 3:15 p.m.

At Elmira, Notre Dame of Elmira battles St. Anthony of Padua from Watkins Glen also starting at 3:15 p.m.
