Saint Maron was born in the middle of the fourth century and spent his life in prayer and meditation in an abandoned temple near Cyrrhus, in Syria. St. John Chrysostom the Patriarch of Constantinople sent him a tender letter from his exile in Cucus, begging his prayers. A monastery, Saint Maron, was built around his shrine. This is said to have given their name to that body of Eastern Catholics called Maronites. His feastday is February 14.
