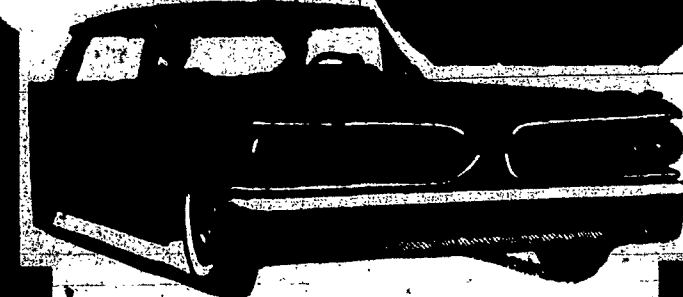

Father says, "We have established a convent, thanks to the wonderful cooperation of St. Joseph, but what to do for an empty house and where to begin."
