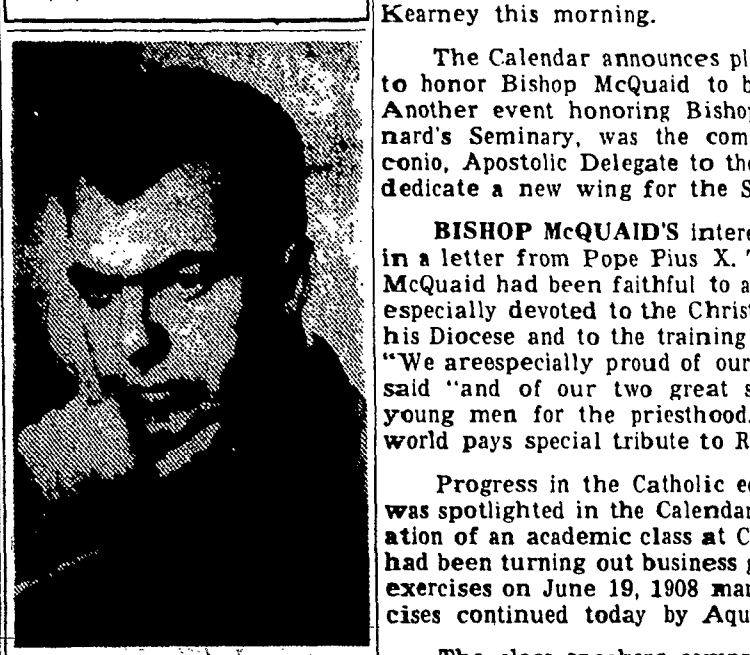

**Looking Back Cathedral Calendar Cites Bishop McQuaid**

The year is 1908. This date appears on a copy of the Cathedral Calendar sent to us by Sister M. Hubertine, a former teacher of ours at old Cathedral High School and later principal of Nazareth Academy and now residing at the academy convent. The Calendar is a souvenir edition to mark Bishop McQuaid's 40th anniversary as a Bishop.

Actual date on the Calendar which was a booklet published at St. Patrick's Cathedral under the direction of Conductor Thomas F. Hickey, rector, was July 12 (Saints preserve us, coinciding with Orangemen's Day). The publication was 5x7 1/4 inches with a purple cover and gold lettering and including photographs, articles on the Bishop and Cathedral parish news.

**DEDICATION** was to Bishop McQuaid, "for his 85 years of noble life, his 60 years in the priesthood and his 40 years in the Episcopate." No editor's name appears but we think the late Bishop John Francis O'Hern or Monsignor George V. Burns, then assistants at St. Patrick's had something to do with it.

Then as now the booklet said: "The Diocese of Rochester has often been called a model Diocese. And in this model diocese with its splendid equipment for all the needs of God's children, there is not an institution that is not a monument to Bishop McQuaid."

St. Patrick's Cathedral in 1908 was located at Platt St. and Frank St. (now Plymouth Ave. North). The site is marked on the Eastman Kodak Co. building by Musa Caravan, Order of the Alhambra. Our Lady Chapel was at the corner of Kodak alley, next on Frank St. was the rectory, then St. Andrew's Seminary. Farther down was Cathedral high and grammar school and Cathedral Hall. All have been removed from the picture but the then new Cathedral Hall which is now St. Patrick's Church, scene of Solemn Pontifical Mass to be celebrated by Bishop Kearney this morning.

The Calendar announces plans for a Solemn Pontifical Mass to honor Bishop McQuaid to be celebrated by Bishop Hickey. Another event honoring Bishop McQuaid, founder of St. Bernard's Seminary, was the coming of Most Rev. Diomedo Falconio, Apostolic Delegate to the United States on August 20 to dedicate a new wing for the Seminary.

**BISHOP McQUAID'S** interest in Catholic education is cited in a letter from Pope Pius X. The Pope said that while Bishop McQuaid had been faithful to all the duties of his office he was especially devoted to the Christian education of the children of his Diocese and to the training of candidates for the priesthood. "We are especially proud of our parochial schools," the Calendar said "and of our two great seminaries for the education of young men for the priesthood. In this regard all the Catholic world pays special tribute to Rochester."

Progress in the Catholic education program in this diocese was spotlighted in the Calendar by its report on the first graduation of an academic class at Cathedral High School. The school had been turning out business graduates and the commencement exercises on June 19, 1908 marked the beginning of these exercises continued today by Aquinas Institute.

The class speakers comprised the entire class. Salutatory was given by Miss Adelaide Margaret Carroll, the valedictory by Miss Gertrude Marie Barry and an oration, "The Catholic View of Education" was given by Cyril Joseph Curran, later an attorney in Washington, D.C.

**NATURALLY I** was interested in the grammar school graduation class. It was my class and while classmates names recall many memories, the number who have died makes us realize that this was 53 years ago. Diplomas were awarded by Bishop Hickey, the class was presented by Monsignor Burns who later became pastor of Sacred Heart, now the Cathedral.
