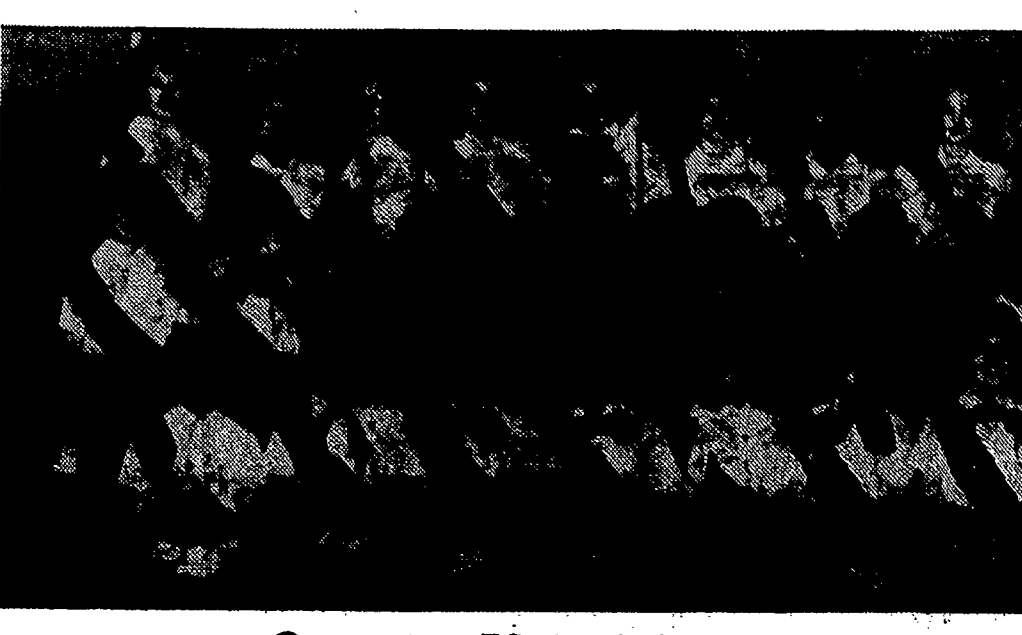

## Who Can Stop Ohio Buckeyes?

In the NCAA, the big question is, "Can anyone stop Ohio State?" Twenty-four teams open play this week in battle for the championship; the grueling runs from March 14th through March 25th.

Regionals begin the play — there are four divisions: East, Mid-East, Mid-West, and West. The first mentioned quite possibly possesses the most formidable teams. Included in the East regionals are St. Bonas', St. John's, St. Joe's and Wake Forest.

The Bonnies (22-3) have combined the superlative attributes of Tom Stith (297), a fast break and an aggressive defense into a coherent unit. Whip-cracking Whitely Martin and super-Soph Fred Crawford complement Stith, a two-year All-American. St. John's relies on good ball-handling and rebounding to demoralize opponents.

The main offensive threat is the jump-shooting of Tony Jackson. Improved St. Joe's boasts 6-5 Jack Egan, a strong rebounder and shooter, and guard Billy Hoy. Both the Redmen and the Hawks have big win streaks going for them. Wake Forest surprised Duke in the ACC finals to gain a berth. They are built around center Len Chappell (24.7).

THE BUCKEYES of Ohio State (24-0) should have little trouble in the Mid-East regionals. Their first severe test will be in the semis against the eastern champs. State is superbly balanced and can adapt to any situation. All-American Jerry Lucas heads this team which is shooting to be the first undefeated major team since North Carolina turned the trick in '56-'57.

Mid-West: This division will probably wrap up in a clash between Kansas State and Cincinnati (23-3). Kansas State, finished strong, uses a deliberate offense highlighted by Larry Comley, an accurate shooter. Cincy, guided by 6-9 pivot Paul Hogue and occasionally inspired by Tom (Little O) Thacker, has ripped off 18 straight wins. Southern Cal and Utah are

the leading contenders in the western regionals. 66 Junior John Rudometkin and Neil Edwards provide the inside-outside scoring punch for S.C. Utah's hopes rest on the shoulders of Bill (the Hill) McGill, a prolific scorer.

The NIT (March 16-25) will be held at Madison Square Garden in N.Y.C. Seeded are Dayton, Memphis State, Niagara and Colorado State.

Dayton literally "caught fire" in the second half of the season, winning 8 of its last 9 tilts. 6-6 Gary Roggenburk, the chief scoring threat, averaged 16.3 a game and hauled down 325 rebounds. Memphis State returns with four starters from last year's tournament; impetus is received from Lowery Kirk and Skip Wolfe. Superior rebounding and a sticky man-for-man defense are Niagara's keynote. Their offense is alternately powered by Al Butler (17.25), a Rochester product, and a pair of soph hot-shots—Joe Madrey and Kenny Glenn. Colorado State lost the backbone of last year's team through graduation but
