

Holy Week Rites Scheduled

Catholics will fill churches this coming week to recall the final, climactic events in the life of the world's Saviour.

Parish Holy Week Retreat will open at the Cathedral on Palm Sunday evening at 7:45. Services will include rosary, sermon and Benediction. Rev. Lawrence Bellew, C.F., will be retreat master.

Confessions daily, Monday through Wednesday, morning 7:20 a.m., 4:30-5:30 p.m., and after each retreat service.

Afternoon Mass, Monday through Thursday, 5:30 p.m.

Confessions Wednesday 3:30-5:45 p.m., 7:30-9 p.m. Brief sermon by Father Bellew at 5:30 p.m.

Holy Thursday—Low Masses at 7 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Bishop Kearney will pontificate at the 4:30 p.m. Solemn Mass of the Blessing of the Holy Oils at 9 a.m.

Parish bulletins should be consulted for exact time of services in each church.

Congregations will make Latin responses at all ceremonies, according to 1955 Vatican instructions. Many parishes will have priests or laymen act as commentators to explain the Holy Week rites.

Holy Week at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Mother Church of the Diocese, will be marked with solemn rites as follows:

Palm Sunday — Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, Cathedral rector, will bless the palm, preside at the procession at 7 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Bishop Kearney will pontificate at the 4:30 p.m. Solemn Mass of the Blessing of the Holy Oils at 9 a.m.

Confessions, 4:30-5:30 p.m. and after the evening Mass.

Holy Communion will be given only at the 7 a.m., 5:30 p.m.

Bishop Casey will celebrate the Solemn Pontifical Mass of the Last Supper at 7:45 p.m. Sermon by Father Bellew.

The Blessed Sacrament will be reserved in the Repository beginning at 8:30 p.m. The Cathedral will remain open throughout Thursday night and Friday morning for private visits and hours of adoration.

Good Friday — Afternoon service will include: Stations of the Cross, 1:45 p.m.; sermon by Father Bellew, 2:10 p.m.; Bishop Casey will celebrate the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion and Death of Our Lord, 2:30 p.m.

Holy Communion will be given during the Solemn Liturgy at 3:45 p.m.

Veneration of the Relic of the True Cross will take place during the Solemn Liturgy and after the evening service.

Stations of the Cross, Sermon by Father Bellew, Benediction with the Relic of the True Cross, 7:45 p.m. Confession heard only after the evening service.

Holy Saturday — Confessions, 3:30 to 6 p.m.

Easter Vigil Service including Blessing of the New Fire, Paschal Candle and Baptismal Water; Renewal of Baptismal Vows; Litany of the Saints, 7:30 p.m.

Bishop Casey will celebrate Solemn Pontifical Mass of the Easter Vigil at 8:45 p.m.

Holy Communion will be given during the Mass about 9:30 p.m. (Attendance at this Mass does not satisfy the Sunday obligation.)

Easter Sunday — 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12:30

Bishop Kearney will celebrate Solemn Pontifical Mass at 11 a.m.

Music for Palm Sunday's Pontifical Mass, for the Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil services and for the Pontifical Mass on Easter Sunday will be furnished by St. Bernard's Seminary Choir. Students of St. Bernard's will also conduct the ceremonies.

National Awards Set At Banquet

The Diocesan Committee on Scouting will sponsor a dinner in honor of Bishop Kearney at Our Lady of Lourdes School Hall on Wednesday, April 12 at 6:45 p.m. Scout Leaders and supporters of the Scout Movement from the entire Diocese of Rochester will attend.

THIS WILL BE the first time since this committee was organized in 1947 that The Saint George Award for Leaders in Scouting under Catholic Auspices will be given to eight carefully selected Catholic Lay Leaders registered in The Boy Scouts of America.

The purpose of this award is to recognize their outstanding contribution to the spiritual development of Catholic Youth in The Scout Movement.

The award was inaugurated at the Thirteenth National Conference of Diocesan Chaplains in January, 1954, at San Antonio, Texas. It is offered to the respective diocese as a national award.

Main event of the evening will be the report to the Bishop by each chairman of the seven councils in the Diocese followed by an address by the Bishop.

KC To Award \$5,700 For Oratoricals

The New York State Council announces the 1961 Oratorical Contest, open to any Catholic boy or girl who graduates in January or June, 1961, from an accredited high school, public or private. There will be elimination contests held first by the council, then by the district, then by the area of which there are eleven. The expenses (not to exceed 100.00) of the winners in the area contests will be paid to the State Convention, where the final contest will be held.

A contest will be held by the Youth Committee, for the Squires, from which one finalist will emerge, who will also participate in the final contest at the State Convention.

The State Convention awards are as follows: Winner — \$2,000 Scholarship; second — \$1,600 Scholarship; third — \$1,200 Scholarship.

Each of the other nine finalists will receive a \$100 U.S. Government Bond.
