

McQuaid Jesuit Reports On Sports Season

Although McQuaid High School's Diocesan Basketball Tournament championship highlighted the Winter sports season at the Jesuit school, there was no shortage of activity in other athletic areas.

THE WRESTLING SQUAD, under Coach Frank Noce, compiled a 7-3 record, led by co-captains John LaDuca and Al Maley. Two of the losses came against Madison and East Rochester, leaders in Monroe County circles, and the third loss, to Penfield, was later avenged. LaDuca and Maley suffered only one defeat apiece during the season and junior Dick Hanford was unbeaten until an injury forced him out of action.

The swimming team, though it was able to record only a single victory, nevertheless received consistent first place finishes from senior Rory Culhane.

And in basketball, the junior varsity team racked up a 14-4 mark under the tutelage of Joe Mancarella. Joe Genter topped the all-soph squad in scoring and Gerry McCabe, a 6-4 center, took care of the rebounding. Both boys were promoted to the varsity five for tournament play.

The frosh basketweavers were just a shade behind the J.V., finishing a 13-5 season with a tight 38-34 win over Aquinas as a preliminary to the big varsity clash at the War Memorial on March 4. Coach Herb Janick's freshmen were paced on offense by Norman "Buzz" Ashenburt at guard and Sam Iannaccone at center.

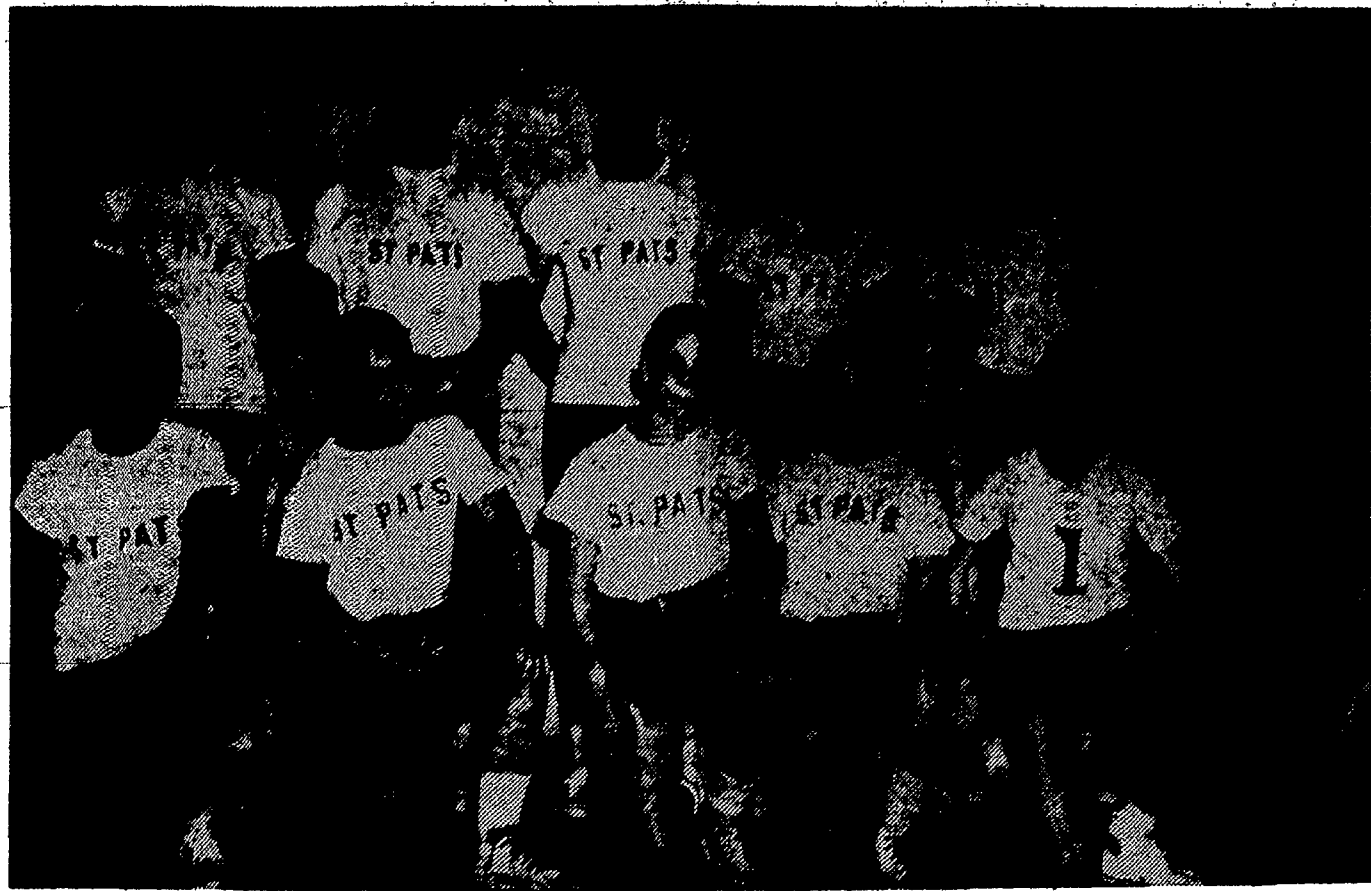

Solemn funeral services for two members of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph were conducted at the Motherhouse, East Ave., Pittsford.

Services of both the Sisters were largely in Elmira with one of them also serving as a school principal in Rochester.

SISTER MARY ROBERT Solemn Requiem Mass for Sister Mary Robert (Hallahan) was celebrated in Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, Wednesday, March 15. A former supervising nurse at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira and former Director of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, Sister died early Sunday morning, March 12, 1961 after a long illness.

The Rev. Philip E. McGhan was celebrant of the Mass assisted by the Rev. James F. Slatery, deacon; the Rev. Joseph Lynch, subdeacon and Rev. William H. Shannon, master of ceremonies.

Also in the Sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Louis W. Edelman and the Reverend Fathers Donald J. Murphy and Francis Peggiani.

BORN IN ELMIRA, Sister Mary Robert entered the Sisters of Saint Joseph from Corning in 1914. After earning her R.N. certificate, she was assigned to St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, as supervising nurse. From 1923-1930, Sister Mary Robert was Director of the School of Nursing at St. Joseph's. She left that hospital in 1945 to become a supervising nurse in the Infirmary at Nazareth Motherhouse and later at St. Ann's Home for the Aged.

Surviving are three brothers, Colonel William Hallahan of New York City, John Hallahan of Clearwater, Florida; and James Hallahan of Corning; also several nieces and nephews.
