

## M. Capparelli Last Rites Held

Seneca Falls—Requiem Mass for Michael Capparelli was offered in St. Patrick's Church by the Rev. John P. O'Beirne, pastor on Wednesday, March 23. Mr. Capparelli, 74, of 14 White St., died March 26, 1961, in the Taylor-Brown Memorial Hospital after a brief illness.

He was the father of Village Patrolman Julian Capparelli and operator of a neighborhood market for more than 40 years.

**BORN IN ITALY**, Mr. Capparelli had been a resident of this community since 1906 and was employed at Gould Pumps, Inc. until 1920 at which time he and his wife Louisa, opened the store adjacent to their home on White St.

He was a member of Moose Club and a charter member and former president of the Sons of Italy. He and his wife observed their 50th wedding anniversary on June 7, 1959.

Besides his wife and son, he leaves five daughters: Mrs. Amelia Picciano, Endicott; Mrs. Josephine Van Are, Winter Park, Fla.; Mrs. Helen Baldassarre, Mrs. Mary O'Donnell and Mrs. Rita Fornesi, all of Seneca Falls; three sisters, the Misses Maria and Philomena Capparelli, both of Italy and Mrs. Teresa Battino of Endicott and 13 grandchildren.

Students are Thomas Cannan, Joseph Mancini, John Valby, Albert Wagner and Stefan Ujaki.

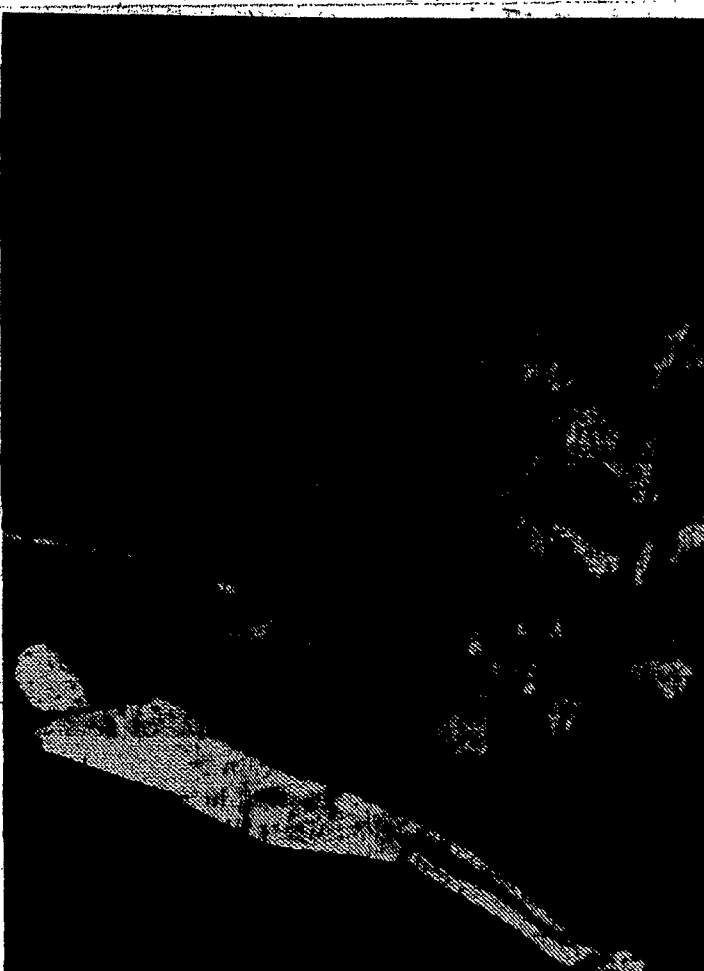
Another McQuaid student, Leo Bosner, received honorable mention at the Pittsford Central High Science Fair for his computer project.

## A Cross for Good Friday

Church ritual for Good Friday requires a cross of significant size so all in the congregation can see and venerate it. Rather than purchase one for the once-a-year ceremony, a nun at the Cenacle convent made one for today's rite. The convent caretaker, Stephen Fenicchia (who made sports headlines in October by rolling a 300 game in bowling) fashioned the basic shape of the body of Christ in soft wood. Mother Mary Pellicane, a native of Long Island and 15 years in the Cenacle order, then overlaid the wood with clay and fashioned the body of the crucified Lord. Last year she made a similar cross for the Cenacle convent at Ronkonkoma, near New York City. She admits she never had any formal art training but has sketched religious subjects since childhood.

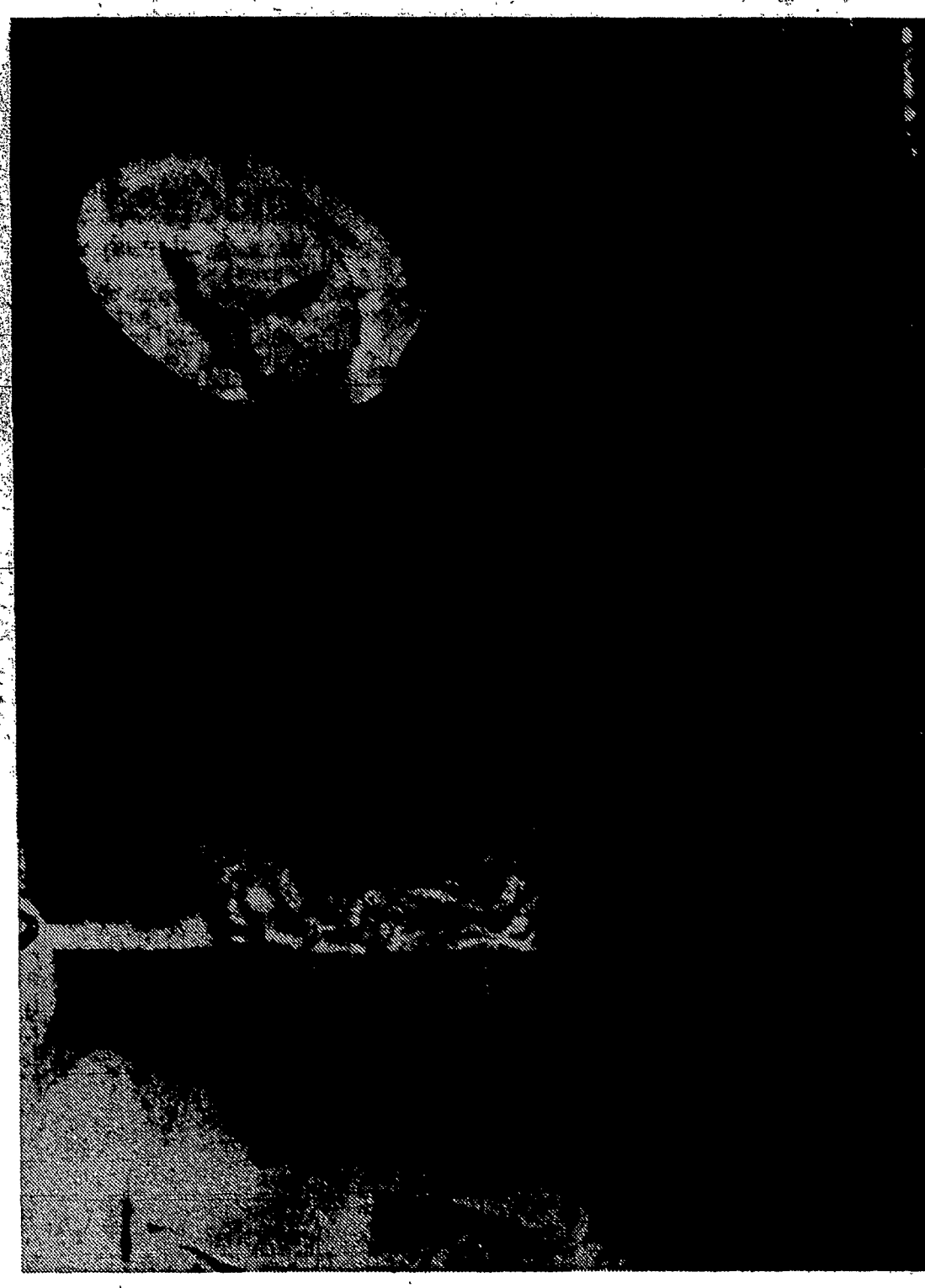

### Chisox Loaded With Veterans

Chicago added pitching depth with the acquisition of Cal McLish and Juan Pizarro. With holdovers, Southpaw Frank Baumann (13-6), Billy Pierce (14-7) and Herb Score, along with righthanders Early Wynn (13-12), Russ Kemmerer and probably holdout Bob Shaw (13-13), Manager Al Lopez can talk of having eight starters and good portside-starboard balance.

All fielding positions except one are manned by veterans. Roy Sievers (.295), Nellie Fox (.289), Luis Aparicio, and rookie Joe Martin comprise the infield; the fly-chasers include Minnie Minoso (.311), Jim Landis and Al Smith (.315). Martin, a left-swinger third baseman hit .285 at San Diego in the Pacific Coast and is considered as more than adequate defensively.

The White Sox led the league in team hitting, fielding, double-plays, and stolen bases (Aparicio had 51). However,

14 players are at least 33 years old — thus forming the oldest team roster in baseball. This age factor must be classified as a liability.

Webster's well-drilled basketball team captured their first Section 5 Class AA championship by downing defending champion 50-41 last Saturday.

A sell-out crowd watched Webster gain an early lead and fend off repeated Franklin thrusts the rest of the way.

The Ridgemen held a three-point advantage at intermission and had stretched it to 37-30 at the end of the third quarter. A late flurry after another Quaker rally wrapped it up for Webster.

Tom Witmer scored 21 points for Webster and received plenty of help from John Ladwig and Jim Gripps, a pair of burly rebounders. Franklin's touted Trent Jackson and Bill Slater scored only sporadically due to the Ridgemen's tenacious defense.
