THE PROGRAM includes Mass IX, a setting of the Proper by Toner, Regina Coeli Jubila and Ye Sons and Daughters of the Lord.

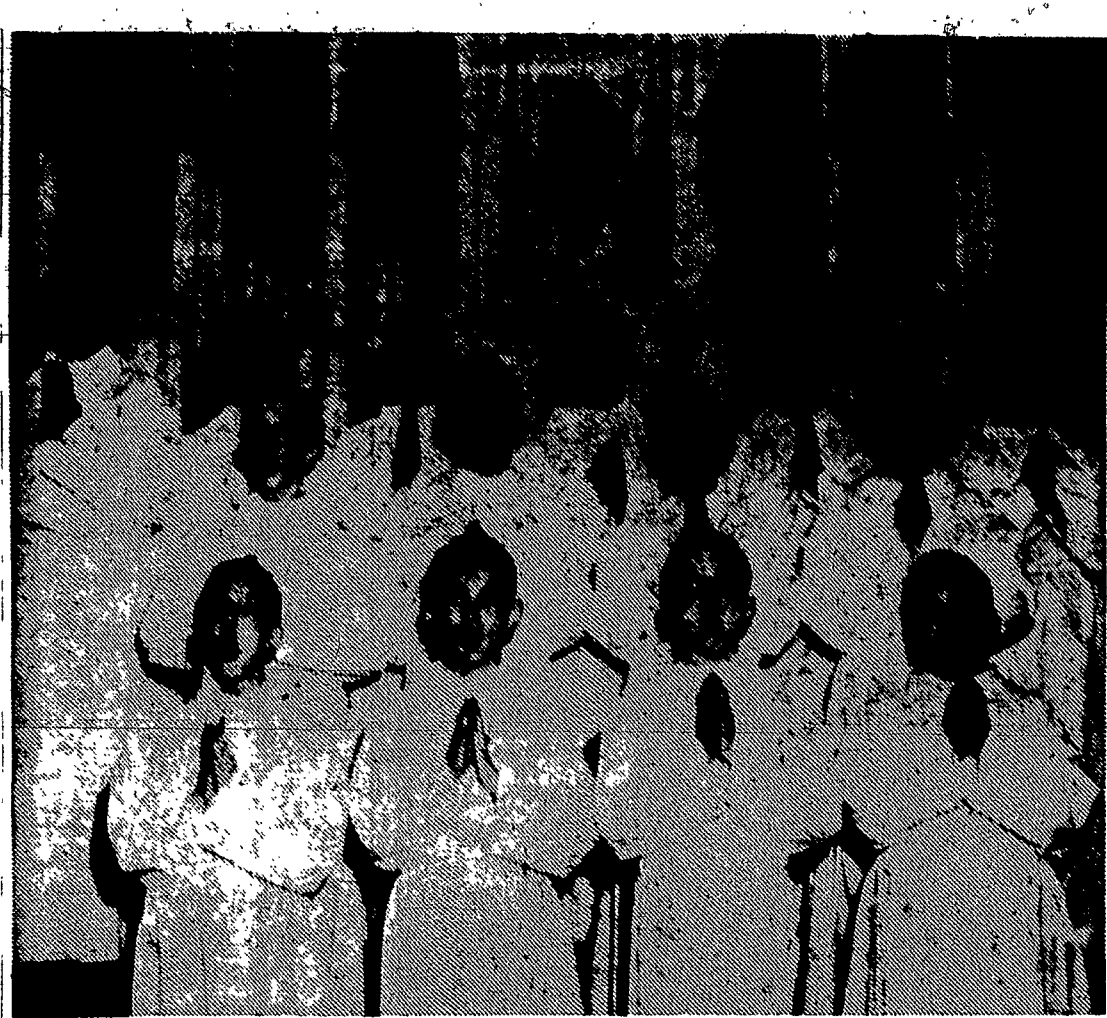
The same choir makes an annual visit at Christmas to the State school at Industry.

The musical show, set for Ascension Thursday eve, will mark the fifth Elmira appearance in recent years.

THE CONCERT band and male chorus are under the direction of the Rev. Paul J. Oigny, O.F.M., head of the department of music at St. Bonaventure University.

An accomplished musician with a wide background of experience, Father Oigny has been in charge of the two groups since he arrived at the university in 1957. Prior to that time, he performed the same duties at Siena College.

The two student units, because of study requirements, are limited to but a few appearances in the East. Both St. Bonaventure groups have to date been booked for appearances at Buffalo and the Veterans' Center at Bath.

THE MALE chorus has been selected to compete in an invitational musical competition scheduled for eastern universities and colleges at Jersey City on April 15.

Musical productions for the Elmira variety show will range from classical, through semi-classical, to modern show hits.

The variety show marks the third event on the alumni association's 1961 calendar. The association earlier this year conducted a membership drive and held a memorial Mass which was followed by a banquet.
