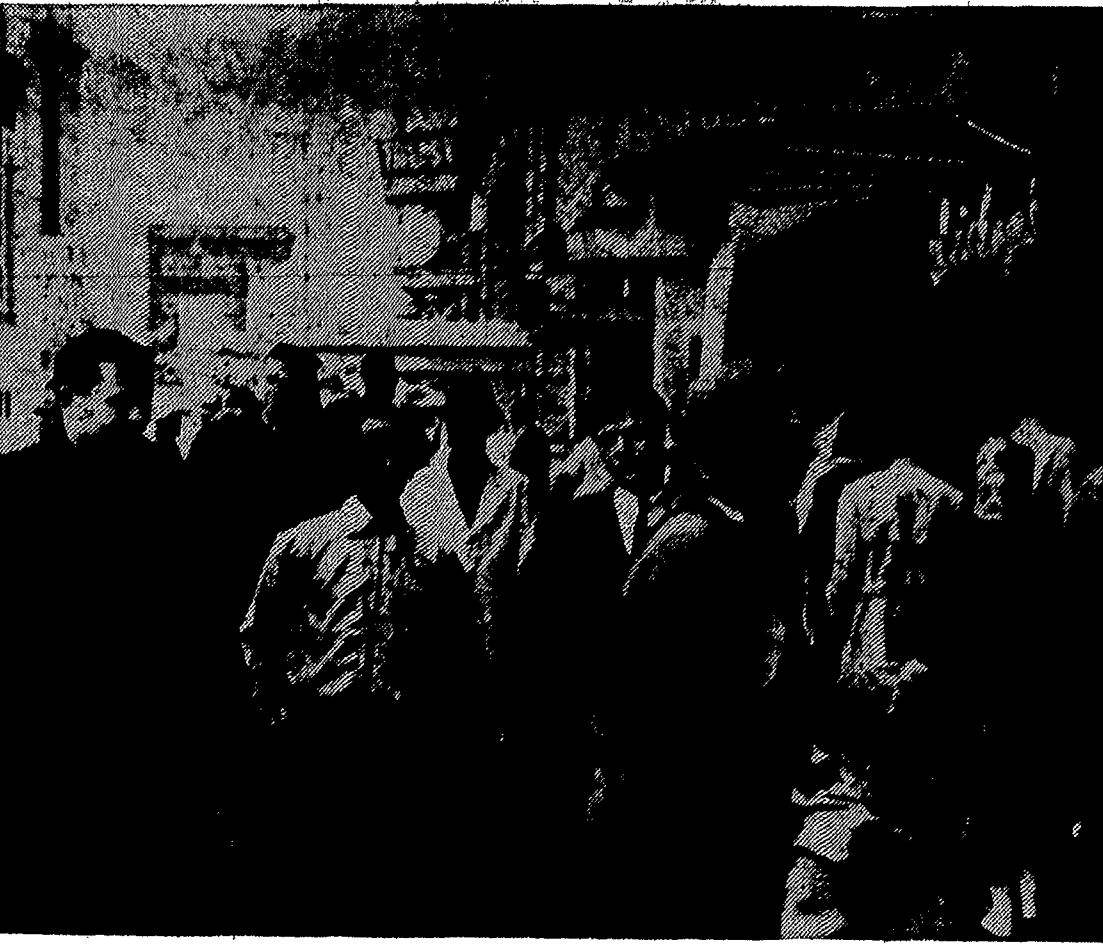

Theatre News

Hamlet

HAMLET — For the first time in my memory and it may be in a century, HAMLET is being played by an actor in his twenties. The Prince was actually thirty, according to the gravedigger in the play. Sir John Gielgud appeared as Hamlet here when he was 32. Maurice Evans was 37. John Barrymore, 40, and Sir Johnston Forbes-Robertson was still playing him superbly when over 50. On the whole, the actual age of a great actor is unimportant, yet the boyishness of Donald Madden's Hamlet is striking because unusual and because the potentials of a very great Hamlet are all there which he has given himself the time to develop. This is not to imply that the current performance is not arresting for this Prince has depth of character, imagination, sensitive, with a sense of justice and passionately loyal.

If the play is to mean anything to the audience, it is essential to make his audience share with him his horror and his reverence when face to face with the ghost of his father and this Madden accomplishes from his first news of the apparition. This point once established the tragedy has gained the sympathy and interest that it needs.

Another crucial point is how to give freshness to the sadly hackneyed "To be or not to be" which Madden carries off bravely, saying the lines softly to himself yet giving them full emphasis and meaning. Over the years, his other soliloquies will burgeon.

At the moment he is strong in his scenes with the other character — except with his Mother who gives him little in return. He is convincing in his

edge of English literature or the drama is only partial. Happy the boy and girl who can see it now at the reasonable rates of the Phoenix in a very exciting production. And what fun to be able later to say "I saw Donald Madden in his first appearance as Hamlet," because Madden is the name of a great actor.

ROOTS — British drama, once dealt with the educated if not the upper reaches of society, has now descended to the basement. Going deeper down, Arnold Wesker, London's pride, has dug into the soil of Norfolk where his hearty farm folk center their lives on food and cattle.

But not Beatie Bryant who found her way to London where a young intellectual, Alexander Scourby, makes the King sufficiently attractive and active man. Beatie returns to Norfolk after two years of Art's culture and art.

Two weeks later, Beatie has rounded up the family, washed and in their Sunday apparel to greet her bridegroom. A huge feast is growing cold when a letter informs her ruthlessly that she is jilted. The family are agitated at Beatie's agony but desperation gives Beatie what she has desired of ever ago. Art had disappeared of ever ago.

Complicating — she suddenly finds herself not only creating ideas but expressing them. She that it is not too much of a can think — she can talk — she has grown up above the suddenly pops up stage center as the only catering to realism is when tapestries are lowered for the Queen's bedroom. Thrones are also rolled on for their Majesties and steps across the stage provide two levels but this is one of the lean productions which cheats the King of a pre-dieu for his night prayers.

The Norfolk dialect strangely seems to admit no singular verb — "He eat — She walk" is the usage. Mr. Wesker writes lengthily but he knows his characters.

Oklahoma Census Set

Oklahoma City — (RNS) — A census in the Catholic diocese of Oklahoma City-Tulsa, which comprises the entire state of Oklahoma, is scheduled to be conducted in early June, the diocesan chancery office announced here.

It will be the first attempt since 1955 to get an accurate report of Catholic statistics in Oklahoma. Census workers, who will be organized on the deanery level, will check each rural and city dwelling to count the numbers of practicing Catholics, those who have fallen away from the Church, and other data.
