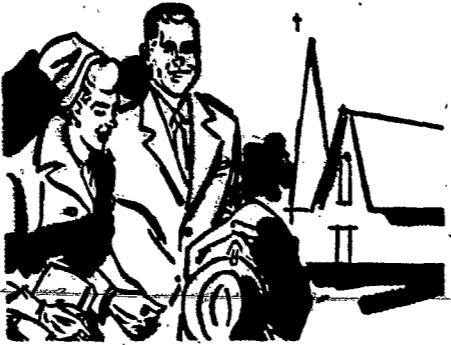


WHAT'S NEW IN THE PARISHES
