

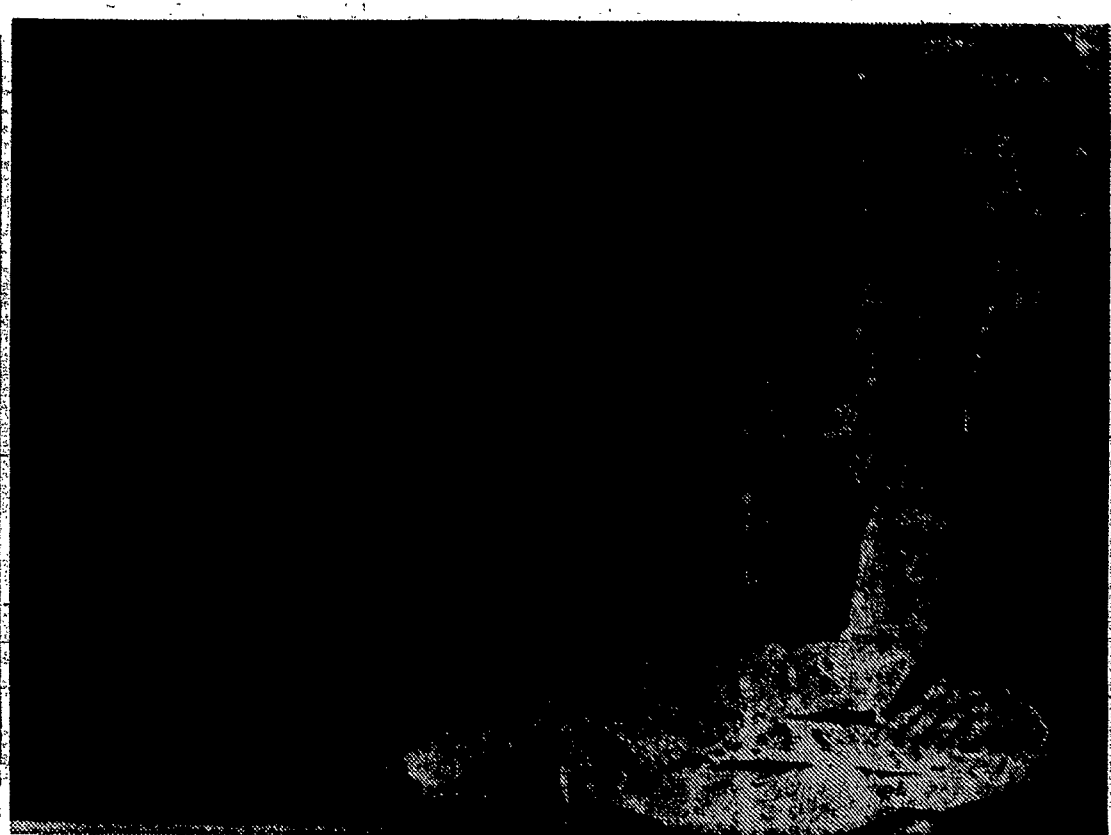
**Miss Corbett

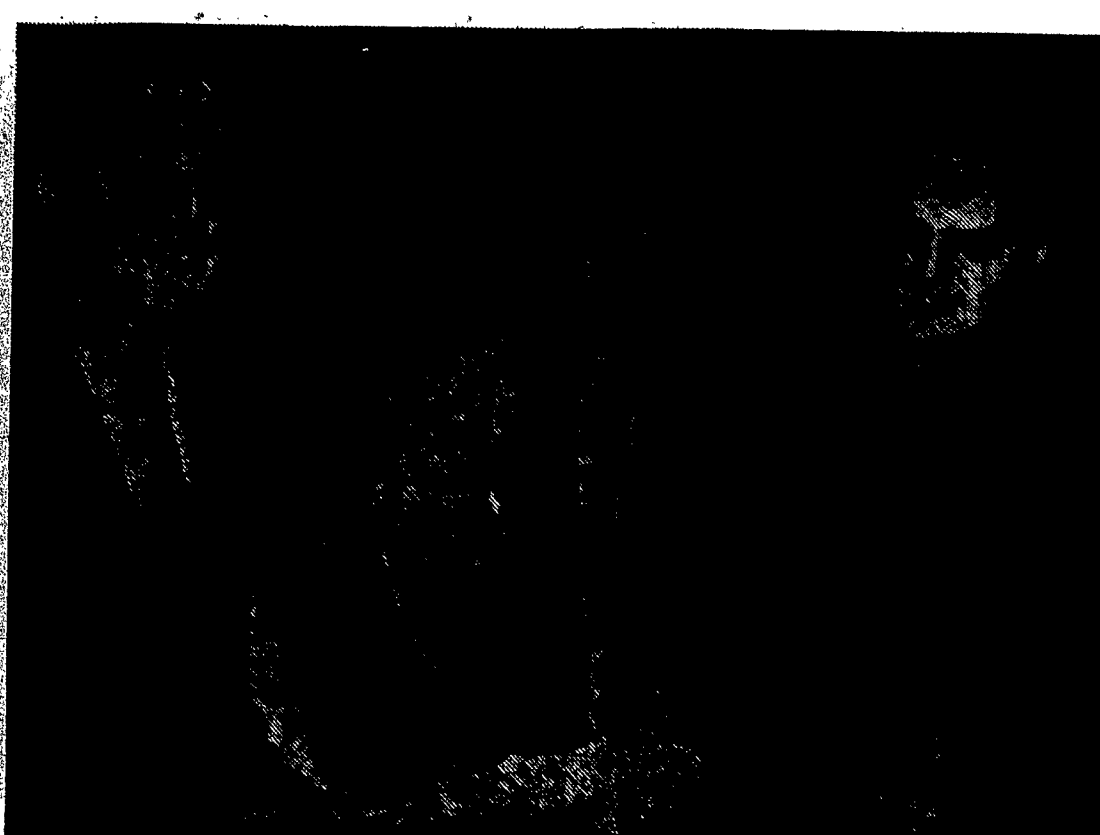

**'Growing Up To Christ', Sodality Day Theme**

For the eighth consecutive year, a large number of young Catholics will spend an afternoon in conference in the annual diocesan Sodality project called "A Day With Mary." Nazareth Academy of Rochester will provide the site next Sunday, April 16, at 1:30 p.m., when Rev. Stanley Grabowski, Assistant Diocesan Director of Sodalities for the Archdiocese of Newark, New Jersey will begin the program with the key-

note address on the day's theme: "The Sodalist, Mature Citizen of The World."

FOLLOWING THE opening address, each of the more than six hundred Sodalists expected to attend will have an opportunity to select two of twelve separate talks on specific aspects of the day's theme given by Rochester area priests. The four hour program will present training a Marian Catholic Action, covering a whole range of such practicable considerations as Lay Spirituality, Devotion to Mary, Principles of Leadership, and Spiritual Direction.

Putting these ideas into practical, apostolic action in the parish and school, as well as understanding the world-wide nature of the Church's need for a spiritually formed and organized laity directed by the Hier-

archy, form the dual purpose of each of the day's seminars.

Two separate sets of sessions comprise the program, one for adults and college students, the other directed to high school students. In the section for adults, the Sodalists can elect one of four topics:

The Nature of Lay Spirituality for The Sodalist: Rev. Paul G. Wohlrab, Assistant Pastor at St. Andrew's Church, Rochester.

The Sodalist in an Established Vocation As Parishioner: Rt. Rev. Msgr. Richard K. Burns, Pastor, St. Thomas the Apostle Church, Irondequoit.

The World Social Apostolate and The Sodalist: Rev. Michael E. Daly, Assistant Pastor, Nativity of The Blessed Virgin

Church, Brockport, and Asst. Diocesan Director of Parish Sodalities for Rochester.

The Sodalist And Spiritual Direction: Rev. Michael Volpe, Assistant Pastor, St. Andrew's Church, Rochester, and chairman for the entire "Day With Mary."

The section directed to high school students builds on the relation between the natural process of maturing and the process of growing in holiness. Accordingly, high schoolers may elect from titles in the program based on "growing up" to Christ - like adulthood and "growing out" to Marian Catholic Action. The program will further break down these talks according to year in High School.
