Priest, Rabbi Authors Scheduled At Colleges

Two internationally known authors will visit Nazareth College and St. John Fisher College next week — one, a Catholic priest, the other, a Jewish Rabbi.

The Rev. Gerald Vann, O.P., distinguished theologian, and lecturer will speak at St. John Fisher College on Monday and Tuesday, April 17 and 18.

Rabbi Ira Eisenstein, president of the Jewish Reconstructionist Foundation, will discuss "Israel's Relations with the New Nations" on Monday at Nazareth College. The lecture is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. and is open to the public.

day: Hope or Despair" on Monday at 8:15 p.m. in a lecture principally designed for the public.

His subject Tuesday will be "The Christian in the Post-Christian World." This lecture, scheduled for 1:30 p.m., is intended primarily for the college students, but is also open to the public. Both lectures will be concerned with the false and unnecessary tensions and anxieties which are prevalent in today's world.

A former headmaster of the English Dominican College, Father Vann has concentrated since 1952 on writing, lecturing, broadcasting and preaching, both in England and the United States. He was educated at the English Dominican College, obtained his theological degree at the Collegio Angelico in Rome and received an M.A. degree at Oxford.

HIS WRITINGS cover many fields—politics, theology, education, psychology and art. Among

his eighteen books are "The Paradise Tree," "On Being Human," and "Morals and Man." The interest in social and international problems evident in his published works also led him to take an active part in the Catholic Council of International Relations after World War I, and to found, in 1927, a "Union for Peace," which was designed to join members of various nations together in common prayer for international justice, charity and peace.

DR. EISENSTEIN assumed his duties as president of the national foundation and editor of its publication "The Reconstructionist" in 1959. He has also served as co-editor of the Sabbath Prayer Book and the High Holiday Prayer Book, as well as the New Haggadah and "Mordecai M. Kaplan: An Evaluation." Among his published works are "Creative Judaism," "What We Mean by Religion," "The Ethics of Tolerance," and "Judaism Under Freedom."

Dr. Eisenstein has travelled extensively and has visited Israel a number of times since 1933. His most recent trip to Israel was in January of this year.

AFTER GRADUATING from Columbia University (Phi Beta Kappa) in 1927, Dr. Eisenstein attended the Jewish Theological Seminary, receiving the degree of Rabbi in 1931. He obtained his Ph.D. from Columbia in 1941 and an Honorary D.D. from the Seminary in 1958.

Dr. Eisenstein served as Leader of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism from 1931 to 1954, when he was invited to become Rabbi of Anshe Emet Synagogue in Chicago (1954-1959). In addition he served as Visiting Professor of Homiletics at the Jewish Theological Seminary in 1951 and President of the Rabbinical Assembly of America from 1952-1954. He has lectured at the University of Chicago, Northwestern University, University of Pittsburgh, University of Colorado and Louisiana State University.

Aides Named For Cayuga United Drive

Auburn — Dr. Paul E. Newman, General Chairman of the 1962 United Community Appeal, today announced appointment of his entire campaign cabinet for next fall's drive for support of 25 United Fund health, welfare and recreational agencies.

Total appointments listed by Dr. Newman were 27. It is the earliest formation of the fund's campaign team in the organization's 39 year history.

According to Dr. Newman, C. C. L. of the Rectifier Components Product Section of the General Electric Co., will be vice chairman and will "shoulder a large measure of responsibility. Lloyd will be in charge of pilot campaigns, the loaned executive program, sponsored luncheons, cultivation of national firms and development of fair share standards for corporate, management and employee giving.

Dr. Frank DeFurio, local physician, who was United Fund budget committee chairman last year, will be associate vice chairman.

Dr. Newman, who is executive vice president of the Beacon Milling Co., a division of Spencer Kellogg, also released the 1962 campaign timetable which schedules 1962 U.C. Appeal-Cabinet named.

A six week public drive between the advance gifts kick-off on Tuesday, September 11 and the final victory dinner on Tuesday, October 31.

Funeral Mass for George J. Dash Sr., father of two Sisters of St. Joseph, was offered in St. Augustine Church, Thursday, April 6. Mr. Dash, 84, of 372 Roxican War veteran and former superintendent of Municipal Hospital, died April 3, 1961 in Strong Memorial Hospital.

SOLEMN REQUIEM Mass was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Duffy assisted by the Rev. Walter E. Fleming, deacon and the Rev. Walter J. Kohl, subdeacon. Also in the Sanctuary were the Right Reverend Monsignors Charles F. Shay and Gerald C. Lambert.

Mr. Dash's two daughters in religion are Sister Mary Cecilia of Blessed Sacrament Convent and Sister Mary George, superior of Holy Rosary convent and school principal.

During World War I, Mr. Dash was assistant to the president of Symington Machine Corp., 1244 University Ave. and negotiated all contracts between the company and the federal government. He left the company to become hospital superintendent.

ACTIVE AT ONE time in the Knights of Columbus he managed the campaign to raise funds for Columbus Civic Center, 50 Chestnut St. in 1923. Besides his two daughters, Mr. Dash is survived by his wife, Julie; a son, George J. Dash Jr.; two other daughters, Mrs. Joseph Porreca of Cranford, N.J. and Mrs. Walter Bull; a sister, Mrs. Laura Quinn; nine grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
